Note from the Pastor

THE EPIPHANY

"I see said the blind man
As he picked up his hammer and saw"



Today the entire world celebrates my very favorite feast, the Epiphany. It is the Feast of the Wizards of "Aha!" ...The Magi, the magicians. Oh, the Church has called them kings because we know what to do with a

king but Matthew calls them astrologers, magicians, magi. What do you do with a magician and what does a magician do? A real magician does not try to hide reality and create illusions a la David No, a real magician unveils reality hidden under the external illusions and today we have the ultimate revelation. Today these three star gazers follow that star and come upon what appears to be a simple, vulnerable baby but they see the reality inside. They see the true gold of Divinity shinning through the dust of his humanity. And there is an Epiphany. God, hidden in human flesh is now made manifest for the whole world to see. God who has been hiding in the Heavens has now come to Earth to be seen and touched and held by those who have eyes to see, hands to hold and hearts to be hold. Do you see it? Do you get it?

I am personally drawn to this Feast Day because of the four major masculine archetypes of Warrior, Lover, Magician and King; I am most at home being a magician. Merlin is one of my patron saints. (And I do resemble and love Rafiki the monkey-priest of the Lion King. I was even born in the year of the monkey but I digress.) The work of a true magician is to never obfuscate but illuminate. I dare say we get into most of our trouble by covering things up, especially what we perceive as our warts and flaws. Makeup, no matter how heavily it is applied will never conceal what we perceive as our human imperfections. But when we remove the makeup and see all the way into the heart of the matter, we begin to perceive a divine beauty that no external comeliness can ever conceal. And that's an Epiphany. It is one that most of us never come to. And yet, it is the one that God wants us to see most clearly. As a matter of fact, Jesus came basically for one reason and that was to reveal the divinity hidden in our wounded mortality. But we just

refuse to see it. Hence, the magicians.

All of us have some of the four major archetypes in us but one usually dominates. The King defines the kingdom and carries it in his person. He is the head, the father figure. If he is healthy, the kingdom is healthy. One usually doesn't access his king archetype until after the age of 50 but once it is there it gives a sense of order and security and identity to all that it touches. As I get older, I discover much more of the king in me and I must confess...it's good to be king. The warrior defends the kingdom. He knows what the boundaries are and what the rules of the game are supposed to be. Warrior energy is in every young boy as he begins to discover his own power and strength. The lover gives juice to life, sweetness and fun to life. And the magician is the one who blows reveille... Wake up! He is the one who slaps you in the face and if he does it well, you say, "Thanks. I needed that." He is the good father confessor to whom you come to expose your sin so that your gift may be revealed. How strange and how like God to use even our sinfulness and brokenness to bring us to fullness and healing in life. Nothing gives me greater joy than when someone in confession comes to a true Epiphany of who they truly are. It really is a moment of A-ha. I see it. I get it. I am always quick to remind them that once they see it and get it, they must act on it to make it a permanent part of their life because in truth, it is. Our truest self, our deepest being is divine. It will take us a lifetime to discover that. Not to worry. We have time. And, besides, it has already been shown to us. It was revealed 2,000 years ago when those who followed the star discovered the fullness of divinity hidden in humanity. What a surprise.

The Elmhurst YMCA Ice Rink is located at 211 West 1st Street (on the corner of 1st St. and Maple Ave).


No pre-registration is required, but maximum capacity for the ice rink is roughly 300, so please come early.

We urge parishioners to begin saving their expired or unused medication. In several weeks we will publish the date for this collection. Participating in this collection will keep obsolete and unused medication out of our sewage system or landfills.
