Note from the Pastor



Well, have you had your fill of Christmas? Of New Years? How about winter? Have you had enough? We are now smackdab in the middle of it. And they don't call it the <u>dead</u> of winter for nothing. It's cold. We've had more than our fair share

of snow (ask night-watchman and Chief Snow Blower Butch) and we are _____ (fill in the blank: tired, depressed, bored, annoyed, _____).

For most of us a certain age (something over thirty-something) winter is a test of endurance. We've survived many before and will survive this one. But it is so never ending. Soon cabin fever will be setting in and as the days grow longer, our patience will grow shorter. And to add insult to injury, in two weeks my television is going blank (I'm an analogue man in a digital world).

COMMUNICATIONS FROM THE BISHOP LATIN AMERICA


Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,
