

# Note from the Pastor



#### **PALM SUNDAY**

It never fails, we are just making the turn in the aisle of life when we hear the announcement over the loud speaker, "Clean up in aisle 5". You turn the corner and sure enough someone just dropped a

large sized jar of Ragu and there is broken glass and red all over the place. It's got to be cleaned up, but who will do it? Enter the young Puerto Rican shelf stocker, Jesús (Hey-soos). He doesn't recite the expected mantra, "dats not my chob, man." He goes immediately and silently to clean up the mess that someone else made. And he's doing it again.

Let's face it. On one level or another we are all in a mess and find ourselves shouting, "Clean up in aisle #1." Despite our best efforts (and God knows how hard we try), in one way or another ---socially, economically, spiritually, physically---the container of our lives holding our life blood has slipped through our hands and now lies shattered on the floor. And we are helpless to clean it up ourselves. Would somebody call Jesús?

He will be right there. The question is, will we be there when he comes to clean up our mess? With us or without us, he's coming to wash all things clean and create all things anew. If we are there to watch him and pay attention to how he does it, we too will be made clean for he is the Master of cleanliness. And cleanliness is next to Godliness. If we are not present, we will simply wander into another aisle of life creating another mess.

Now, the question is, are you going to show up? For 3 days, the 3 holiest days of the year, the Sacred Triduum, the Master will not only show us the way to cleanliness, wholeness and life but show us that He is the way. And if we miss it, we miss life's greatest lessons.

On Thursday, Jesus will get down on his hands and knees and wash our feet. If the feet hurt, the entire body hurts. And our feet are killing us. If our lowest parts, our feet are cleansed, massaged and dried with love, we are made whole. Now, what he has done for us, he mandates us to do for one another. It is the great Mandatum, the order of God to wash each other's feet that the whole world may be healed and cleansed. And in our washing of one another's feet, we are cleansed.

On Friday, we will be washed cleaned not only by water but by blood. Are you washed in the blood of the Lamb? "This is my Blood, the new and eternal covenant, it will be shed for you and for all and to the cleansing, and forgiveness of sin." From His side on the cross, there flows blood and water, life blood and cleansing water. Will we take the time to kiss that cross and embrace his willingness to die so that we might have life? Or will we be too busy wandering the aisles?

On Saturday evening, the holiest day of the year, he will come once again not just to clean up the aisle but to cleanse and conquer the biggest mess of all...death. You see, Jesús is not just a Puerto Rican boy, he's God...hidden in human flesh. All human flesh must die but because of Him, His Divine Spirit eternally resides in us. Even if our mortal flesh dies, we will live forever for we have been baptized, washed clean, given new life in the blood of the Lamb.

This Saturday evening, three of our most beautiful and precious children will enter into that baptismal bath with Jesus to be given the pledge and promise not only of cleanliness but of the fullness of life. Will you be there to witness it, or are you just too busy or bored?

The greatest drama of life is about to unfold before our very eyes.

Holy Thursday, 7:00 pm. Good Friday, 7:00 pm. Holy Saturday, 7:30 pm.

The question for us will ultimately be, were you there? Be there.
