Note from the Pastor



DIVINE MERCY SUNDAY

Today is Divine Mercy Sunday. There is a wonderful story about a man before a judge who was most just. The man was shaking in his boots and had utter fear in

his eyes. The judge noticed this and commented, "You have nothing to fear in this court, you will get justice here." Without missing a beat, the man blurted out, "I know that your honor. That's what I am afraid of. What I need is mercy, not justice."

Mercy, mercy, mercy me. What a beautiful word. What a magnificent gift. How interesting that when we begin mass by confessing our guilt we ask not for justice but for mercy. Why? Because, as St. John tells us, all have fallen short of the glory of God. All are guilty. And the guilty will be punished? Only if we were God and thank God, we're not. We have a quid-pro-quo sense of justice; an eye for an eye, a tooth for a tooth. It is hard wired into our fallen nature. We consider it a virtue. It makes us feel well...justified. When an offender is executed we feel relief, a little safer, back in control. Justice has been served.

Now, don't get me wrong. I'm not putting down justice (I'm penning this note from the home of a retired judge). I've spent a good deal of my life advocating justice for the poor. Justice puts back balance in a world out of kilter, out of balance where those who are doing well, are doing very, very well. And those who are not, are suffering by the injustice of those in power. If we are to take the teachings of Jesus seriously, we *must* make justice our aim. On the level of society, in the outer world, social justice is part and parcel of the Gospel of Jesus.

But there's another level, another world. It is the inner world of the soul and the heart that connects the inner and outer. It is precisely here that we need mercy. Without it, we will be sawing the saw of history in the same place forever and never having a break through. The reason is that all of us in our fallen nature feel a little cheated. We never have enough justice from our perspective. If you take out my eye, I want an eye and an ear to make things just again. You then want an eye and an ear and a leg. Then you feel justice is done but I don't, so I'm going after your hand, preferably the one that goes into your pocket book. And so it goes and there's never any real justice. That's why we need mercy.

In today's gospel, Jesus' first appearance to his disciples after the resurrection, if he was just, just, there would be hell to pay. After all, they betrayed him, they abandoned him, they denied him. They sinned against him, big time. Yet what are the first words out of his mouth, after the resurrection? Shalom! Peace! All is forgiven. No need for justice, He is offering Mercy.

Mercy is the unearned gift of love and reconciliation on the part of the given. It is pure grace, it is pure gift. In the risen Lord there is no revenge, no price to be paid. It is a whole other realm we are in, it is the Kingdom of God where mercy reigns supreme.

Today is Divine Mercy Sunday. And as we have received, so must we give.

Mercy, upon mercy, upon mercy. How sweet it is.

COMMUNICATIONS FROM THE BISHOP

Bishop Sartain wishes to express his sincere gratitude to those who contacted their legislators expressing opposition to HB 2354, the State FOCA proposal. This bill has been defeated and will not be called for a vote. This great accomplishment would not have happened without decisive action by the Catholic faithful in the Diocese of Joliet and across the state of Illinois.

We now have the opportunity to contact our legislators once again. This time we need to ask our elected officials to vote yes on HB 3700, a bill that will truly reduce the unnecessary taking of innocent human life. HB 3700 would mandate that an ultrasound be offered to an expectant mother prior to an abortion.
