Note from the Pastor



Last Tuesday, January 19, was a stellar day for the dioceses of Joliet. After years of waiting, our new Auxiliary Bishop, Bishop Joseph M. Siegel, was ordained to the Episcopacy by our Ordinary Bishop J. Peter Sartain. And I am a happy man

Probably my greatest joy in the priesthood is to watch people grow and mature in the Lord. If I get a chance to be a catalyst for that growth, all the better. Now, I have not had much of a direct influence on the spiritual development of Joseph Siegel, but I know and knew, very well, those who have. And they have made all the difference.

One of my mantras is that no one grows in the spiritual life without a model. If the life of the Spirit is anything, it is both counterintuitive and paradoxical. It is not left-brained logic. That may help you balance your checkbook but it is useless when it comes to understanding that, "the first shall be last and the last shall be first, that the poor are blessed and if you truly want to live, you have to die." Go figure that out. You can't. You can only see it lived in someone else and then sense their authenticity and integrity. That leads you to try and embrace the paradox as well.

The best definition I ever heard of a Christian is "one who has met one." Believing that Jesus is the Son of God is very important, but it will not save us. Even the devil knows that Jesus is the Son of God. Salvation comes not from just believing a set of dogmas, but from daily following the Christ into the mystery of His (and consequently ours) cross and resurrection. We can only do this if we have already seen it done. And Bishop Segal saw it in one most close to him, his mother.

In the early 70's at St. Charles Borromeo High School Seminary, I had the privilege of teaching along side Joseph Siegel's mother, Marie. Marie Siegel was a tall, big woman (she reminded me of the Julia Child of the clerical set) and as good and as kind as a human being could be. She was the high school seminary's Spanish teacher and in many ways den mother for the boys. With 100 adolescent boys and a mostly male faculty, we needed all the feminine presence we could get. And she was. There is a saying that one woman (man) of faith makes a majority. It is our faith that puts us into communion with the Divine and then the Divine shines through us. This was most manifest in Bishop Siegel's mother, Marie.

It is also manifest in his priest-mentor, Father Tom Sularz, who is presently Pastor of St. Daniel the Prophet in

Wheaton and my very close friend. All young boys need to be initiated into the mysteries of life. Without this, they become loose cannons, never truly knowing who they are or where they are going. From very early on, Bishop Siegel received marvelous modeling and direction as a young seminarian and baby priest from Fr. Sularz. There is a wisdom energy that is passed from one generation to the next if the student is ready and the master is willing. Would that every young boy and man have such a master. Joseph Siegel did and does.

Bishop Siegel now begins his ministry to all of the Dioceses of Joliet. As he has been taught, so will he teach. As he has been formed, so will he model what it means to be a man of God and a shepherd after the heart of Jesus. God has given our dioceses a very precious gift in Bishop Siegel. May we now receive from him what he received from those who went before him....the love, the presence and the life of Christ.

SENIOR CITIZENS INVITED TO DEFER PROPERTY TAXES

Qualified senior citizens, aged 65 years and older are invited to apply for the Senior Citizen Real Estate Tax Deferral Program. The program allows participants to defer property tax payment until the property is sold. The deferral is treated as a loan and accrues 6 percent simple interest until paid. To qualify, the applicant's household income cannot exceed \$50,000. Additionally, the property must be used exclusively for residential purposes. The application period closes March 1, 2010.
