Note from the Pastor



Wait a minute. Wasn't Christmas just yesterday and didn't we have poinsettias in the church last Sunday? And now it's all purple. It's Lent. In two blinks of an eye, it will be Easter (and for those who are suffering through the winter, it can't come soon enough.) In the meantime, the Church

has wisely given us 40 days (which is better than Moses' 40 years) to prepare and get ready. The message for the season: Since it will move so fast, don't waste the time. It is too important. It's Lent.

The word Lent comes from the old Anglo-Saxon meaning lengthening. (I knew we had broken the back of winter when it was still light after the 4:30 Saturday evening Mass.) Since the days are getting a little longer, it is time to shed some light on our spiritual life. While our spiritual life is a 24/7, 365 day enterprise, for the next 40 of those days we are called to focus and to concentrate not only on our relationship to the Divine Source of all life, equally important on our relationship to each other and even ourselves. To do this the Church gives us three wonderful disciplines to practice, skill sets if you will, to help us go deeper into the heart of God and consequently live fuller the life he gives us. The disciplines, of course, are prayer, fasting and alms giving or works of mercy. Today we look at prayer.

One of the questions I never tire of asking little children in confessional is, "Do you pray?" To which they usually respond, "Ah, hmmm, sometimes we say grace at home," or "I say the Our Father at night." Most wonderful is when they report to me that mommy or daddy (I love when it's daddy) tucks me in at night and then we say our prayers together and he teaches me how to ask for a blessing for the family and the cat and the dog and stuff like that. While that is so wonderful, it is rare that I hear it. I can not begin to tell parents how important it is for them to pray with their children and not just for the kids' sake, but for theirs. Pray, pray, pray, pray! But how?

One of the stock truisms that I find myself speaking incessantly is, "in the divine conversation between our God and ourselves, God always, always, always speaks first." God spoke and the world was created, God spoke again and the Word became flesh, God spoke and we came into being. And God continually speaks to us every moment, waking or sleeping, of our lives. Another question I never tire of asking children is, "Have you ever heard the voice of God? Have you ever heard God speak to you?" The king of France once asked Joan of Arc how she, a peasant girl heard the voice of God when he, the king of all France had never heard God speak. Little Joan replied, "Oh, you r majesty, but he does speak to you. You just don't know how to listen." God continually speaks, but we are pretty lousy listeners. And God speaks most loudly in silence. As a matter of fact, I dare to say that God's language is the language of silence.

One of the reasons it is so hard for us to hear the voice of God is because we live in a world of so much noise, both external and internal. Years ago I picked up a young hitch hiker in Hopkins Park. He asked if he could put on the radio. I agreed. The music he chose was so awful that I had to turn it off. "Please," he begged, "Can I please turn the radio back on, I need to hear it." No. I would not turn it back on. He asked me to stop the car and he got out. He thanked me and walked away. He just couldn't stand the sound of silence.

Worse than the external noise we daily endure is the internal babble of our mind that never ceases. Of all the spiritual practices necessary to hear the voice of God, silencing the perpetual motion mind is the most difficult. Yet that is exactly what we are called to do in this Holy Season of Lent.

Our prayer is not so much to try to get God to change His mind about our needs. Jesus tells us he knows our needs even before we say them. No, our prayer simply makes us available to God. We do not need to chase God down to get Him in. We simply have to make room for Him. He is already inside speaking. He just needs a quiet audience.

Try this. For the next sixty seconds, clear your mind of all thoughts. Ready? Begin.

Not too easy, is it? Just as nature abhors a vacuum, so does our mind. It gets filled with thoughts, anxieties and lists of things to do. One of the Lenten practices I encourage you to do is to just be quiet for 60 or 120 seconds. One or two minutes, that's all. Try this. And if you want to learn more about this manner of prayer (it's called contemplative prayer) let me know. If there is enough interest, I would be happy to meet with a group on an irregular basis to teach it.


In the meantime, pray. It's Lent. Pray, pray, pray, pray, pray.
