Note from the Pastor



"AND WHEN YOU GIVE ALMS DO NOT LET YOUR RIGHT HAND KNOW WHAT YOUR LEFT HAND IS DOING"

"No one can serve two masters. That person will either hate one and love the other or be attentive to one and despise the other. You can not give yourself to God and to mammon."

Normally, Jesus is a "both/and" inclusive teacher. He pulls together opposites (life/death, sin/grace, body/spirit) and bears them together in His "body/soul" in the great dance of redemption. But not here. Not in this instance. This one is radical and it can be only either/or. Here Jesus shows his truest monotheistic colors. You get a choice, either you serve and love God or you serve and love mammon. Mammon is defined as riches, avarice and worldly gains personified as a false god. Sometimes it's translated simply as money. And so Jesus poses the question, who do you serve? And he unequivocally insists that you can't serve both. One He sees as a false god, and the other as the true God. And if we let this sink in and truly understand it (and not simply gloss over it like we normally do) we discover that this is pretty tough stuff.

A false god or idol is anything we give our attention to, put our trust in and work for. From a purely time wise perspective, if we are honest with ourselves, we probably spend a lot more time pursuing mammon than we do seeking God. Instead of allowing the very spirit of God to permeate who we are and what we do in every instance, we compartmentalize the Divine and relegate him to Sunday morning. Why? We don't mean to but we get caught up in pursuing mammon. And logically so. There's not enough money to pay the bills and feed the family, to educate the children and clothe the body. Who is going to do this? God? The danger here is that this pursuit becomes all encompassing, all consuming and consequently a false god, an idol. And in this country and culture, an American Idol (boy, they named that right).

Indeed, mammon has become a golden calf before whom we bow. What are we called to do about it? Ah, the third discipline of Lent. The first two are prayer and fasting, the third and sometimes the most difficult to do is alms giving and works of mercy. Serious alms giving and works of mercy. Why? Because it relativizes what so easily becomes an absolute in our lives, earthly gain and comfort and all the power and prestige that goes with it.

So how do we relativize the golden calf? Give! Give not from the leftovers but from the heart. Do! Do go out of your comfort zone to give comfort to the afflicted. The Walk-in Ministry, the food pantry and PADS are always looking for more volunteers.

I am very happy to report that in our little community of Mary Queen there are marvelous signs of gift giving. Off the top of my head I can name scores of parishioners who, as a way of life give as it has been given to them. And in the spiritual life, you can never give it all away. It keeps coming back 30, 60, 100-fold. I hope you've read the article in last week's bulletin about two of our very young parishioners, Claire Gornick and Maggie McDonough who through a project for school raised over \$2,000 for the people of Haiti. Our Confirmandi are now working on various projects with the \$100 seed money they were given at the beginning of the year to see what they could do with their "talents." Last Sunday, at the small gathering of our Peace and Justice Committee, all were edified by the story of Greg Mortenson, author of "Three Cups of Tea" and were so moved by his example that they are seriously thinking about an intergenerational parish mission project to the Navajo reservation in New Mexico or a parish mission to Sucre, Bolivia. Anybody interested? Mary Queen is possibly the most resource rich parish I have ever had the honor to serve. Oh, what we could do if we were to tap into those spiritual, financial and educational resources for the ushering in of the Kingdom.

Next Sunday we will have an opportunity to seriously relativize our golden calves. Next Sunday we are asked to generously give to the CRS (Catholic Relief Services). It was the CRS that co-sponsored our pilgrimage to the Holy Land this last December. They are a major force in the reconstruction of Haiti and are already in Chile responding to the needs of the Earthquake victims. Anywhere there is a need in the world, CRS is there. They do outstanding work with very little overhead. I ask you for a true sacrificial Lenten gift to them because it's a gift that will keep on giving. During our mission last week, I took up a collection for the free health clinic at my old Parish of St. Teresa in Kankakee. This is the little clinic that could. Without any outside revenue, only donations from individuals, they are taking care of the needs of those without insurance, without health care. There are not paid staff members, only volunteers. If you did not get a chance to give to the clinic, you may do so by simply making out your check to Mary Queen and marking on the outside envelope "clinic."

When all is said and done, all is gift. Life is gift. Give, as it has been given to you.
