Note from the Pastor



"Hosanna to the Son of David! Sing Hosanna!" Chanting and waving palm branches the people welcomed Jesus into Jerusalem. It is a great triumph. Unfortunately, it doesn't last long. In a few days they will turn on him, blame him for all their woes and crucify him.

He will die. Fortunately that won't last long either. In three days He will rise from the dead to live forever. We know the story. It is now time to retell it and to liturgically live it.

When asked to tell what he thought was the most wonderful part of Catholicism, Fr. Andrew Greeley said, "It's the wonderful stories and our sharing of them." Indeed, it is. And this next week we will not only tell the story but we will relive it. Far and away it is the greatest story ever told in the most wonderful of settings...our local church.

Today we march. Tomorrow our priests will go to the cathedral of St. Raymond for the Holy Chrism mass. It is the mass of the oils. It is the celebration of priesthood and the beginning of the holiest week of the year.

Tuesday and Wednesday are quiet. Keep it that way. Thursday we begin the sacred Triduum (the Holy three days). At 7:00 pm we will gather in the church for a bilingual liturgy of the Lord's Supper. We will hear His great mandatum, His order for us to wash each other's feet. And we will be obedient. What we do in ritual we are to do in life.

On Friday we will walk the way of the cross, hear the last words of Christ, and most importantly at 7:00 pm meet again in the church for the ancient prayer service and the veneration of the sacred cross, the cross of our salvation.

On Saturday all is silent again until the eve. At 7:30 pm along with the elect and candidates the entire church will gather to relive that night, that holy night when we await the resurrection of the Christ. We shall not be disappointed as those who have been preparing will be plunged into the waters of new birth and regeneration, the waters of baptism. Those who have been preparing for full communion will make their profession of faith, join us at the table of the Lord and be anointed with the spirit of gladness. And all of us will make real once again that which we celebrate: the death and resurrection of Christ.

Come. Today we march. Tomorrow we celebrate.

PALM SUNDAY OF THE LORD'S PASSION

What a day of ups and downs! We start out with the account of Jesus' triumphant entry into Jerusalem. In Luke's version, which is proclaimed this year, we hear the crowds reprise the refrain of the angels. In Luke, at Jesus' birth the angelic choir sang out, "Glory to God in the highest and on earth peace to those on whom his favor rests" (2:14). Today, it is the citizens of Jerusalem who shout, "Peace in heaven and glory in the highest," as Jesus rides by. Completing the circle from angelic to human to every created thing, Jesus tells the Pharisees who want him to rebuke the crowd, "If they keep silent, the stones will cry out!" (19:40). This is a day of exaltation!

But it doesn't take us long to hit the lows that are also part of this day. The story of the Passion reminds us that even though Jesus was hailed as the king riding through Jerusalem, he was also crucified under that same title: Jesus of Nazareth, King of the Jews. Yet even as he hung upon the cross, Jesus' words spoke of forgiveness. He prayed, "Father, forgive them, they know not what they do." He said to the repentant thief, "You will be with me in Paradise."

In some ways the experience of this day reflects what happens to us in everyday life. For the most part, our life is a series of ups and downs. There are days when things go well, and days when life seems to treat us badly. What is called for is a response consistent with a Christian way of living. In his darkest moments, Jesus did not give up hope. He promised the thief paradise. Jesus also did not give in to vengeance, but instead forgave. How we live through the ups and downs of life will reveal how we put into practice each day the example given to us by the Savior.

Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

As you may have read in *Christ Is Our Hope* magazine, the Diocese of Joliet will begin our observance of a special Year of the Eucharist on Holy Thursday, April 1, with the Mass of the Lord's Supper. This celebration will conclude on June 26, 2011 – the Solemnity of the Body and Blood of the Lord. The goal of this celebration is, to borrow the words of Pope John Paul II, to rekindle Eucharistic "amazement and gratitude" in all the people of our local Church – clergy, religious and lay faithful. The Eucharist is the heart and soul of our Catholic faith, yet for various reasons we can take it for granted and fail to appreciate the tremendous gift that is offered to us in this sacrament – the very life of the Risen Lord Jesus. We can become like those disciples on the road to Emmaus who walk with the Lord, who converse with him, yet fail to recognize his presence. The purpose of the celebrations and programs to be offered during this Year is to help all in our diocese to deepen our love, understanding and appreciation of the Holy Eucharist and thus inspire a spiritual renewal in all areas of parish life.

The motto for the Year of the Eucharist is "Bread of Life – Covenant of Love." This motto reminds us that as Jesus gives Himself to us in the Eucharist to be our spiritual nourishment, He also draws us into a deeper relationship with Him and with all the members of His mystical body, the Church. In that spirit, all parishioners in our diocese will be joining in a special prayer after Communion at each Mass during this Year, asking our Eucharistic Lord to embrace us individually and as the Church ever more intimately. The patroness of this Year is our Blessed Mother Mary, under her title, "Our Lady of the Blessed Sacrament." We will be seeking her intercession as well as that of special patrons each month.

A Steering Committee and various subcommittees have been working for many months to plan this Year of the Eucharist, and a listing of these special programs and events can be accessed on the Diocesan website (www.dioceseofjoliet.org) by clicking on the Year of the Eucharist logo. As part of this observance, all parishes are invited to offer some form of Eucharistic devotion on a regular basis during this year. Various parishes and Eucharistic Chapels throughout the diocese have been designated as pilgrimage sites, and we hope to receive permission to grant a plenary indulgence for those who visit and pray at those sanctuaries. Well-known speakers have been invited to offer presentations on the Eucharist in different areas of the diocese. Our Catholic School teachers and Religious Education catechists will be participating in workshops to assist them in teaching about the sacraments of the Holy Eucharist and Penance to our children. Clergy and parish staffs will be participating in programs on the new translation of the Mass texts to help them introduce these revised prayers in our parish liturgies (probably in Advent 2011).

All these programs and activities will lead up to our **Diocesan Eucharistic Congress on June 26, 2011, at Lewis University in Romeoville.** During this celebration, we will have prominent speakers offer presentations on the Eucharist, activities for families and people of all ages and cultures, and conclude with a large celebration of the Eucharist and a Eucharistic Procession. Please be sure to mark your calendars and plan to attend this gathering of our Diocesan Church as we celebrate the source and summit of our Catholic faith – the Holy Eucharist.

Be assured of our prayers for you and your parishes during this Year of the Eucharist and please remembers us and all the clergy in your prayers as well.
