



Note from the Pastor



Resurexit sicut dixit! "He is risen just as he said!" For the past 40 years I've begun every Easter note with this proclamation. It is the centerpiece of our faith; it is the centerpiece of our life. From the time we are smallest children we connaturally know that we are meant for something more. Before

our immortal soul takes on flesh we have a glimpse of Divine Eternal Life. Once we are born and begin to grow, we sense that there is something deep inside of us that we cannot forget and for which we long. It is Eternal Life, Divine life. We all want to live... forever!

When I was a little boy I attended my first wake at the age of 7. It was for a little girl in my brother Joe's class who had died at the age of 8. I can remember whispering a prayer at the wake. "Please God, I just want to make it to 8 ½." Needless to say that prayer changed every year as I grew older. Let me make it to 15, 50... and now I think 85 or 88 would be nice but I have a hunch when I'm 84 I will up the ante. In short, I want to live forever. Well, surprise! I already am sharing in Eternal Life.

Now, if I can just wake up and realize it. If I can just wake up to the Eternal Life that I already am. And that's what this Paschal mystery culminating in the resurrection of the Christ is all about. And when we come to the full realization that we too are part and parcel of this resurrected eternal life, we too must shout with the Saints who have gone before us, Alleluia! He is risen! And so are we. We shall not die because we cannot die. We are the Body of Christ and Christ is risen.

Confused? Don't be. There's a wonderful "proclamation of faith" written by the Gospel music writer Grayson Brown that goes like this, "Jesus died upon the cross. Christ arose from the dead. And just as sure as the sun will rise, Jesus Christ my Lord and Savior will come again." (I'd like to teach it to you. It's good soul food music). What does this mean? It means the eternal Logos, the word of God in the fullness of time took on flesh and became mortal. All of creation is passing away, all mortal flesh must die. Of all God's creation and creatures we are the only ones who are aware, who realize that we are going to die. And we don't like it one bit. There is something in us that wants to live forever. And that something is Eternity, God. If the Eternal were not in us, we would have no desire for it. But as it is, we all have this restless wanting for more, for life, forever.

A few months ago we celebrated the feast of the Incarnation, the Eternal Word took on flesh and blood among us. As a man from Nazareth, He came to show us the way to this Eternal life that we so desire. And the way is through death. As painful as it is, there is no other way. And to help us on the journey, Jesus the Christ sent us the first fruits to help us through this most difficult, yet life giving process, He sent us His Holy Spirit, the Spirit of the Resurrected Christ. And the Christ can never again be killed for He will, and so shall we, live forever. Hold onto that. That's what transformed the world. That's what gives us life in the here and now, in the difficulties we are called to endure. It is life Eternal and it is ours.

Resurexit sicut dixit, Alleluia, Alleluia, Alleluia.

MEMBER SOUGHT FOR DIOCESAN **PASTORAL COUNCIL**

One male representative is being sought to represent the parishes in our area (Cluster 1) on the Diocesan Pastoral Council. Representatives on the Council have an opportunity to discuss issues facing our Church with the Bishop and other Council members, and to make recommendations to the Bishop. Persons serve a three-year term.

Applicants need to be practicing, involved Catholics who have the ability to listen, who can follow through on commitments, and who are willing to attend general meetings of the Council and convene meetings of parishes in their cluster in between the general meetings.

General meetings are held at St. Charles Borromeo Pastoral Center three times a year (the second Saturday of October, February and June). Diocesan Pastoral Council representatives meet with parish council presidents or others once (for a total of three meetings) between each general meeting to give parishes an opportunity to communicate their concerns, etc. to the Diocesan Pastoral Council.


