

Note from the Pastor



Well, have you made all your New Year's resolutions? May I recommend one more? Today, we celebrate the Feast of the Baptism of the Lord. Today, the young man Jesus comes to His full stature in understanding who He truly is. More than

just the carpenter boy from Nazareth, the son of Joseph and Mary, He discovers His true identity, His true Self. And in truly knowing Himself as to who He really is, He can now love Himself. Now He is ready to give the great command.

The New Year's resolution I recommend to you today is to focus on just one little part of that command, the part about loving yourself. We know the great Commandment: You are to love the Lord your God with all your heart and all your soul and all your strength. And you are to love your neighbor as you love yourself. I have come to believe that it is almost impossible to love our neighbor if we don't love our self. And the Scripture itself tells us that we can not love our God if we do not love our neighbor. So we begin with the self. The question is which self? The false self or the True Self?

All of us have two identities. One is given to us by our family, culture, religion and society. The other is given to us by God. The first is called the egoic self, or what Thomas Merton referred to as the "false self". It is basically who we think we are or who we have been told we are. We get it by separation and comparison. I'm not this, I am this. We spend the first half of our life building a good strong, hopefully healthy ego and sense of self. It is a necessary first step. But if by the age of 35 or 40 you identify only with your egoic self (which you have basically created in your mind) you will never fully live nor can you ever fully love. Our living and loving will always be conditioned on how people respond to the little me. How smart am I, how rich am I, how thin am I... how's my hairline?

We have another self, however. It is our True Self. It is who we truly are. It is who we are in God and who God is in us. That's it. Nothing more, but certainly nothing less. This Self can not be offended or wounded because it is not predicated on people liking us or not liking us or winning the game or losing the account or ... It is predicated on the fact that we are a child of God and that this God loves us without condition. That's the identity Jesus received when He came out of the Baptismal waters and heard the voice of God name Him, "You are My Son." And so are we... the sons and daughters of God. Now that's a self you can love.

What does this look like in everyday life? Recently my daughter, TuAnh sent me the quote that describes quite nicely the nature of true self love. And it's pretty liberating and worth printing.

"As I Began to Love Myself"

As I began to love myself I found that anguish and emotional suffering are only warning signs that I was living against my own truth.

Today, I know, this is "AUTHENTICITY".

As I began to love myself I understood how much it can offend somebody. As I try to force my desires on this person, even though I knew the time was not right and the person was not ready for it, and even though this person was me.

Today I call it "RESPECT".

As I began to love myself I stopped craving for a different life, and I could see that everything that surrounded me was inviting me to grow.

Today I call it "MATURITY".

As I began to love myself I understood that at any circumstance, I am in the right place at the right time, and everything happens at the exactly right moment.

So I could be calm.

Today I call it "SELF-CONFIDENCE".

As I began to love myself I quit stealing my own time, and I stopped designing huge projects for the future. Today, I only do what brings me joy and happiness, things I love to do and that make my heart cheer, and I do them in my own way and in my own rhythm.

Today I call it "SIMPLICITY".

As I began to love myself I freed myself of anything that is not good for my health - food, people, things, situations, and everything that drew me down and away from myself.

At first I called this attitude a healthy egoism.

Today I know it is "LOVE OF ONESELF".

As I began to love myself I quit trying to always be right, and ever since I was wrong less of the time.

Today I discovered that is "MODESTY".

As I began to love myself I refused to go on living in the past and worry about the future. Now, I only live for the moment, where EVERYTHING is happening.

Today I live each day, day by day, and I call it

"FULFILLMENT".

As I began to love myself I recognized that my mind can disturb me and it can make me sick. But As I connected it to my heart, my mind became a valuable ally.

Today I call this connection "WISDOM OF THE HEART".
