

Note from the Pastor



Do you remember the old commercials? Miller Lite: Does it taste great or is it less filling? Certs: Is it a breath mint or a candy mint? These lead to last week's note about the glass: Is it half full or half empty?

In our examination of our own brokenness, fragmentation and alienation, the glass looked pretty empty, especially when we are so full of ourselves. The more bloated we become by constantly consuming the empty calories of a superficial society, the more the glass looks half empty. But is it really?

It doesn't take much to argue the other side. Truth is, if we were asked if there is more good than bad in our lives, the majority of us would say without hesitation, absolutely more good. If we start counting our blessings against the stresses of our life, most of us would respond that we are more blessed than stressed. And when we focus on the good, the true, the beautiful and the love in our lives, we become aware of how grateful we truly are. Our spirits lift and our glass is not only half full, our cup overflows... until we stumble and fall and find ourselves once again running on empty. Oh dear, oh dear, here we go again. Is the glass half empty or half full?

Most of us, by the time we learn to pick and choose, accept and reject, find ourselves in what is called the 'dualistic mind'. The dualistic mind is an either/or mind. It follows the old philosophical dictum that says, "A thing can not be and not, not be at the same time." Either it's good or it's bad, you're a communist or a capitalist, you are a friend or an enemy, you are with me or against me. You are happy or you are sad. Well, which is it? Make up your mind.

Well... can it be both? And can it be both at the same time? One of the sure signs of both a mental and spiritual maturity is moving from an either/or mentality to a both/ and mentality and mind set. We grow in truth and life when we are able to move from the dualistic to what is called 'contemplative mind'. The contemplative mind is able to take in all of reality just as it is without dividing and splitting it into good and bad. It does not immediately judge and reject. It is able to see all the way through. It is the mind of Christ. It is the very light of Christ.

The genius of Jesus (and obviously the genius of God) is the ability to hold opposites together, embrace the paradox and allow new life to flow from it. The dualistic mind says either you are God or you are man. The contemplative mind knows that the Christ is both fully God and fully human. He is the one without sin who became sin for our sake. He is the one who kisses the leper, invites the outcast to the table and proclaims that the Kingdom of God

belongs not to those who get it right, have the answers, or are rich and powerful, but the children, the prostitutes, the tax collectors. He is the one who bears the tension of the cross. It is the cross that holds opposites together, life and death, heaven and earth, sin and grace. And that is the mystery of life we are all invited in to.

Is the glass half empty, or half full? It is both. Have you ever experienced joy in the midst of great sadness? Have you ever experienced sadness in the midst of great joy? Are you aware of how sinful you are and at exactly the same time how precious and beautiful you are? What a marvelous mix we are.

God Bless This Mess!! And keep us moving forward into Your heart. Are we saints or sinners? Good or bad? The answer is, yes.



COMMUNICATIONS FROM THE BISHOP CATHOLIC RELIEF SERVICES



Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

It is time once again for the Catholic Relief Services (CRS) collection. In many ways, families are the heart of our communities. When families are in distress, are separated, or are otherwise challenged, our Church reaches out. And it does so whether those families are in our own Diocese of Joliet or halfway around the globe.

For example, the Catholic Legal Immigration Network Inc. (CLINIC) program called National Pro Bono Project for Children matches unaccompanied immigrant children with legal service providers. These children are the most vulnerable migrants. They are usually without resources and are forced to navigate complex legal proceedings without representation. As another example, the Department of Migration and Refugee Services (MRS) of the United States Conference of Catholic Bishops provides coordination, training, funding, and monitoring to experts who provide specialized assistance to victims of human trafficking in the United States. And in its initial response to the earthquakes in Haiti, Catholic Relief Services distributed food to nearly 900,000 people. Currently, CRS is providing food to more than 90,000 students in more than 270 schools, as well as monthly food rations to more than 100 orphanages and childcare centers in Port-au-Prince.

The Catholic faithful in our diocese have always been extremely generous in contributing to CRS. Our diocese is continually one of the largest contributors to this worthy cause, and I am proud to report that in 2010, we collected \$329,826.67. The work being supported through The Catholic Relief Services Collection prioritizes family by protecting children, fighting for family reunification, and supporting the life and dignity of each human person. Each organization supported by this collection sees Jesus in disguise. Can you please help? Please be as generous as you can. This year's Catholic Relief Services collection will take place the weekend of April 2-3, 2011. Your support will truly make a difference.
