## Note from the Pastor



I am not here this weekend. I am at I.C. preaching at all the Masses in preparation for their Parish Mission. It begins tonight (Sunday) at 7:00 p.m. and runs through Tuesday. Since our own Parish Mission was in October with Fr. Meninger, we will not have a formal mission here this Lent. You certainly are invited and encouraged to attend the mission I will be preaching at our sister parish.

Taking my place this weekend is Fr. Scott McCawley. Fr. Scott is one of my former students (at a certain age everybody becomes one of your former students) whom I taught at St. Charles Borromeo Seminary in the early 70's. He's a great musician, a master of the bagpipes and always has something worthwhile to say. Enjoy him.

Since I am not here in person this weekend to ask you, I write to you to seek your help. It is something I ask you to take most seriously: Pray for our young people who will be Confirmed in the Holy Spirit of Jesus Christ next Sunday.

Two weeks ago several members of our teen group, Destiny, and I had the privilege of addressing our Confirmandi, their parents and Godparents. It was a wonderful, powerful night. The teens were nothing short of great as they modeled for their younger brothers and sisters what it means to be a Confirmed Catholic-Christian. It means nothing less than a radical "yes" to Jesus the Christ. It means first to invite Him into our lives to take up residence and then ultimately be invited into His life to follow where he leads us. It's a big deal. And we told them so.

At the end of the night, three of our teens held up crosses with the crucified Christ on them. We then invited the Confirmandi to make their commitment to Christ in a public way by coming forward to kiss the feet of the crucified. This is not cheap gesture. It means that they are willing to walk with Christ all the way through their life with Him at their side and they at His side. If you are not ready for this commitment, stay in your pew. It's okay. No one will judge.

The many came forward and kissed the feet of Jesus. Now it's our turn. Here's where we come in. No one enters into or grows in the spiritual life alone. By definition, we are all connected to each other in the Spirit of Jesus. They will grow and mature in their faith only insofar as they are in communion with others who are mature in their faith, who have walked the walk with Jesus. And that's you.

So, here's what I am asking of you. And I ask you to take it most seriously. The following is a list of the names of our Confirmandi. Pick one and pray for him/her. If you have the same first name, that's your boy or girl. If your last

name begins with the same letter as their last name, that too is your child. This way, every one of them they will have several people praying for them. And there is no greater power on earth than the power of prayer. This is what I ask you to pray for: That the Holy Spirit already living in them come fully into their consciousness; that they may be aware of who it is in whom they live and move and have their being. It is the Christ. Pray that that Holy Spirit fill them and guide them in all that they do. Pray that they be faithful in every way to Christ and His Church, the people of God. Pray that when hands are laid upon them and when they are anointed with the oil of gladness that they may be filled with the Holy Spirit and rejoice in His presence. Pray.

*Hail Mary*

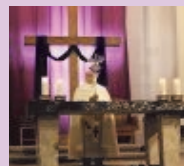
Pray for us, O Holy Mother of God.

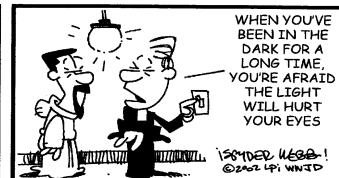
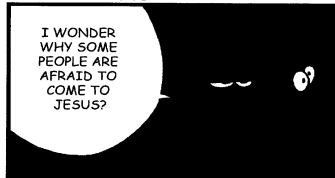


### MARY QUEEN OF HEAVEN PRESCHOOL AND KINDERGARTEN ENRICHMENT
