## Note from the Pastor



#### **Remembering Mama**

There is a rather famous Mother's Day article written by Louis Grizzard who quotes coach Bear Bryant in a commercial he recorded for the telephone company.

The tag line as written said, "You call your Mama, you hear?" And then as an afterthought he adlibbed, "I wish I could call mine."

Today is Mother's Day. Call your Mama, ya hear? If your mother is still with you, no matter what, no matter where, no matter how, call her! I wish I could call mine. It will be ten years in February that my mother joined the love of her life, my father in the celestial realm and today, Mother's Day, I am missing her and remembering her.

My mother lived to be 87 years old and while her early life was not easy, it was a good life. I imagine for most of us, viewing our own lives from a distance, we find them not particularly easy, but ultimately pretty good.

My mother, Angelina (Angie) was the fifth of eight children born to my grandparents who emigrated from Calabria at the beginning of the last century. I never knew my grandparents but to hear my mother tell the stories, my grandmother was a saint who suffered in silence and my grandfather was a no good drunk whom my mother placed squarely in hell until the very last years of her life. The stories of her childhood and of the Great Depression of her young adulthood are legend and have grown into the consciousness of our family folklore. The stories about how she had to go to work after the 8<sup>th</sup> grade, hiding from my grandfather under a bed when he was in a drunken stupor and breaking his fingers with a stick when he tried to reach for her, going to work with cardboard in her shoes to cover the holes and ... need I say more? As children we would just smile and scratch our heads incredulous of the horror stories of her history. "Did you ever laugh and have fun, Ma?" we would query as little children. "Of course we did, most of our time was spent figuring out how to outsmart the old man, hide his stash of wine, and sneak the extra bowl of pasta. We kids had to be really close to each other just to survive. My mother insisted that her life began on the day she married my father (even on that day the old man made her scrub the kitchen floor before the wedding and was too drunk to walk her down the aisle).

My parents married on September 19, 1936 right in the midst of the Great Depression. My father worked for the WPA while attending night school to learn how to be a machinist and then a tool and dye maker. My father got his first real job after his to-be boss assumed that "Taschetta" was a German name (no Italians need apply). My mother went to work. No one worked like my mother: "J.P. Smith, Florsheim Shoes, Automatic Electric, Sunbeam, and finally in the mid-60's she was the first saleswoman at my brother's newly opened store, Wheaton Religious Gift. She stayed at that cash register until she was 83 years old. (I come to my own workaholic status honestly.)

After four years of marriage, my oldest brother Phil came along. Three years later, my brother Joe was born. My mother almost died in delivery and so under doctor's orders, she was to have no more children. Thirteen months later... surprise (yea, but the surprise kid is always a lot of fun). Since my mother came up the hard way, she could be tough as nails. A second grade memory of mine was of the three of us little boys along with my father sitting in the office of the builders who for some reason would not give us the keys to the new home they were building for us in Wheaton. I do not remember what the issue was but this I do remember. I remember my mother turning to them, and proclaiming, "You see these three little boys? If you don't let us into the house we have already put the down payment for, you can keep them. You can raise them. We're leaving." She left that day with the keys to the house. She also left with her kids.

Now in the midst of all this, unless you misunderstand, my mother was one of the funniest, warmest, most loving people God has ever made. I remember being in line at a grocery store when the poor women before us didn't have enough to pay for her groceries with her food stamps. Without batting an eye, my mother paid the difference. She knew what it was like to be poor. In addition to her three boys, she raised three other young people who lived in our household at various times. She was forever taking someone in (I come by that honestly, too). And could she cook! My mother's greatest joy, bar none, was to gather her family around her table of plenty to partake in the banquet of life. Laughter and wine and pasta and the homemade bread she made every Saturday graced our table every Sunday afternoon. Every meal she cooked was a holy communion of family and friends.

And over all of this, no, through all of this was a woman of profound faith. She got it from her mother and passed it on to her children and her children's children. And today, her children's children's children. Grace goes on forever. Sin doesn't have to.

The scriptures are clear, "The sins of the fathers are passed onto the children to the third and fourth generation but... the mercy of God is forever." The sins of my grandfather indeed got into my mother. But they didn't stay there. They were healed by the mercy, love and security that my father gave her. I've often said I got all of my talent (and my neuroses) from my mother and any sanity that I may have from my father.


## Note of the Pastor (cont.)

With all that my mother went through as a child and as a young person and even as an adult, with all the difficulties, her life was very, very good.

The scholar of the soul, James Hillman, wrote in his book, The Soul's Code, that the soul, before it is born, chooses its own parents. It chooses them on the basis of what it will need to fulfill its life. It doesn't choose them on their virtue, but on its own particular needs to grow and mature and to live. Often, the most soulful, mature people are the ones who have had one parent with unconditional love and maybe one parent who was really problematic. The soul needs someone to push against, grow against, mature with. How often we have heard and I believe it is true, that there are no mistakes in God. We get the parents we need. In the economy of God, nothing is wasted, especially the trials and travails, the valley of tears we all must walk through. In the grand of scheme of things, in the Divine plan, everything belongs.

And as I reflect on this Mother's Day, remembering my mama, I give thanks to God for having chosen her for me (or me for her). She ain't the Virgin Mary, but she's my mama and I will love her.... forever.


