Note from the Pastor



TRY TO REMEMBER AND DO THIS IN REMEMBRANCE OF ME

Tomorrow (Monday) is Memorial Day. It is a day to remember. We create memorials so that we might call to mind and remember someone or something in the past that has shaped our present. And yet, it doesn't always work. We call our local hospital Elmhurst Memorial Hospital and for the life of me I am not sure who we are trying remember. I'm sure it was somebody or something that made the hospital possible. Today we remember those young men and women who gave their lives to make our life as we know it in this country possible. But we don't know their names. There are too many of them. A few years ago I stumbled upon an American WWII cemetery in Italy. For three hours I walked through that cemetery being utterly overwhelmed by the sheer vastness of it and the number of lives that were lost to that war. Somehow, this is something worth remembering.

And so we do. From the time I was in 7th grade, every Memorial Day I fronted the Wheaton Junior High School marching band as its drum major. As I grew, so did the bands. High School and then the best band of them all, the Wheaton Municipal Band. Many of them were middle aged, overweight and did not make for spectacular marchers but, boy, could they play. When the band began the National Emblem march, or the Stars and Stripes Forever, all parade goers were surrounded by a wall of sound that sent chills up and down the spine. As the colors paraded by, the townsfolk stood at attention with hands over their heart and tried to remember. It's Memorial Day.

But are we called to just remember the warriors or the glories of war itself? How many of us of a certain age remember how poorly we treated the returning home Vietnam veterans because the war in which they were drafted to fight was so hated. It was a national shame how shabbily we acted toward these young men and women who fought in the horrors of a senseless war. We as a nation have since learned to distinguish between wars in which everybody loses and the young people who are caught in the crossfire of them. And so today, praise God, we can honor our warriors and legitimately question and protest against the wars.

Today we celebrate another Memorial Day as well. It is one we celebrate every Sunday in which we are admonished to, "Do this in remembrance of me." What are we trying to remember? What's the memorial? That one of our own laid down His life that all might live. That one, of course, is Jesus. And in this sense, he was just like one of our war warriors. But there's a difference. And the difference is not in the movement of self sacrifice, but in the goal and

the end of the sacrifice. In war, we want to dominate. In sacrificial love, we are called to liberate. Here we enter into the battle and into the fray of human hatred, armed with the weapons of love and forgiveness. And according to the teachings of Jesus, they are the only true means of bringing about a lasting and permanent peace.


No permanent peace was ever brought about by violent means. If we indeed live by the sword, we shall die by the sword. The great changes, the radical changes in our society are caused by the non-violent warriors like Gandhi and Martin Luther King who entered into the hatred of humanity with truth and love they transformed the human heart. This too is a remembrance worth remembering. These are the warriors for peace and we pray that God continues to send them into the world as agents of God's goal: That all may be one.

And so today we remember. We remember our warriors of war. But we also pray for and remember our warriors of peace and that the peace makers, wearing the armor of truth and light, may enter into the fray of a broken world to make it whole. And bring it peace. As we do that, we celebrate Memorial Day. We do it in remembrance of the One who came to bring us true peace.
