

Note from the Pastor



MIMI BEGINS... AGAIN

Last week as I shared with you about the priesthood and my anniversary. In it I stated one categorical truth: You cannot step in the same river twice. That's the

dictum of the ancient Greek philosopher Heraclitus. means that the only constant in life is change. All living things both grow and decline, have a life span and then a death (and then a life again). From the cells in our bodies to the gray matter in our brains, we are in a constant state of perpetual motion. It is that way in the spiritual life as well. Something has to go for something else to come. St. Paul put it this way, when I was a child, I thought as a child... now that I am an adult I have put away the things of my childhood. He is speaking of his childhood faith as an observant Jew which has been now changed and transformed into his living en Cristo, in Christ. He doesn't cease being a Jew (and even an observant one) but his Judaism has now been transformed into the living Christ. His whole understanding of God, himself and the community has radically changed, transformed. And the transformation goes on.

I dare say, this work of continual transformation into who we are in God is a lifelong process that goes on forever. Now, while this process of change is inevitable, it is never easy. We are comfortable with the old: the old ways, the old thoughts, the old habits. We don't like to change. Change is often very painful because we have to let go of something we have been holding on to and are not sure if the new will be better than the old. Somehow we'd rather live with the devil that we know than the angel that we don't. It is for this reason that all of us, especially in the spiritual life, need a catalyst for change, an agent of change. We all need a model for what the spiritual life can and should look like. We need our St. Francis and Mother Theresa and on the local level, our Spiritual Elders.

With my 40th anniversary approaching, I have been doing a lot of praying and thinking about my priesthood, what it is and what it is supposed to look like. I have come to truly believe, in addition to pastoring, preaching and celebrating the Sacraments with you that one of my major roles is to be a catalyst, an agent of change. I can do this only in so far as I allow myself to be transformed and changed into the Christ. As a baby priest, I will never forget the words of Bishop Blanchette who told me to never expect my people to be any holier or God-centered than I am. It is for this reason I take my own continued spiritual growth and development most seriously. I see my spiritual director on a regular basis and I endeavor to make prayer the center of my life. I don't write this to spiritually brag but to simply state what is necessary for the spiritual growth of this

community.

I can't, however, do it all alone, nor should I even try. St. Paul tells us that we are all members of the Body of Christ each with our own special gifts to give to the community. I stand in amazement as I watch unfold in our little church all the ministries of love and service that you share with one another. But even with all of this, I still need some more help. And help is on the way. Beginning next week, Mimi Wolak is moving into a full time position as Pastoral Associate of Mary Queen of Heaven Parish. And, oh Mimi, I am thrilled you are coming on board.

For the past several years, Mimi has worked for the Parish on a part-time basis as the director of the RCIA, as well as our bereavement minister. Now she will be taking on all the duties of a pastoral associate. What is pastoral associate? Much of what I do, excluding of course the administration of the Sacraments, Mimi will do. That means that she will be a catalyst for our transformation and spiritual growth in the Lord. And she is well positioned to do this. If Mimi knows anything, she knows change and growth into the Lord.

As most of you know, on September 4th, Mimi will be undergoing a major change in her life. On that Sunday, she and our Deacon Tom Nolan will exchange vows and become one in the sight of God. Talk about a transformation. In addition to this, she will be taking on a lot of new duties as pastoral associate. She will continue with the work of bereavement and RCIA but will now also coordinate the various organizations, movements and commissions in the parish. Mimi has a marvelous eye for detail and her administrative and organizational skills far surpass my own (Bozo the clown's surpass my own). Most important of all she brings a love for the Lord and His Church, the people of God. With a firm gentleness and kindness, she will be a wonderful catalyst of God's grace for all of us as we grow in the Lord.

Welcome, Mimi. In your new and changed role, we're glad you're here.
