

Note from the Pastor



Every once in a while something comes out of a homily that really hits a chord. When that happens, nobody is more surprised than I. It is a truism that the things that are closest to you and that you take for granted, you assume everybody else sees

and understands. I write about the homily I shared with you on the Feast of the Ascension. It was all about letting go.

I have often joked that were I ever a Bishop (thanks to my children and grandchildren something that will never happen) my coat of arms would read, "Let go and let God." I have also said that everything I know and everything one needs to know is contained in that couplet taught to me by the old black matriarchs of Hopkins Park. As a young priest, I would marvel at the true joy and happiness that emanated from a people who suffered so much. Many had to choose between food and fuel in the winter time. Others had children in jail or on drugs. The poverty was (and is) palpable. And yet in the midst of true depravation and pain there was an incredible equanimity, peace and joy. Where in the world did this come from? It came from the secret that they knew and practiced in the depth of their being. They knew how to trust God for everything.

This radical confidence, this radical trust is what we call faith. And our faith in God as manifested through the life of Jesus which tells us that no matter what is going on in the external world, in the depth and the core of our being we are being loved without condition. We are being held in a way that we can never hold ourselves and the act of faith is to surrender to that love... "to let go and let God".

And yet...and yet there is nothing harder in the world to do. We truly are the original Klingons. As I shared in the homily, we cling to our parents, we cling to our thoughts, we cling to our ways of doing things and we cling to our children. Boy, do we cling to our kids. I was reminded of that two weeks ago as I re-watched finding Nemo with my grandchildren. Talk about an overprotective clinging father. God forbid his child should be left alone to make a mistake and possibly learn from it. The wisdom figure in the movie was Dori (my new found hero as I am beginning to have short term - not to mention long term - memory loss). Dori chides him, "If you don't allow him to do anything... then he won't be able to do anything." How can we pick ourselves up if we never fall on our face? As a matter of fact, I am convinced that until we fall on our face, we can never really get up. The secret is being allowed to fall. And trusting that in the fall, we will be held by One greater than ourselves.

We can never be held, however, until we let go. I have had countless parents in my office weeping over their own adult and older adolescent children. No matter how much they do to try to change their self-destructive behavior, it doesn't work. The harder they try, the worse it gets. It is then that I usually teach them the parent's prayer. I prayed the prayer at Mass and a number of you have asked to have it reprinted, so here it is.

A Parent's Prayer

Lord, before they were mine, they were yours. And I can't believe this. but I'm told that you love them even more than I do. And that you want to see them alive even more than I do, fully alive And therefore, I give them back to you. I let go of them. I give you permission to do whatever is necessary to help them see what they obviously are not seeing right now. I only pray that you watch over them, you guard them, you protect them. Amen

I have recently decided to start working on a new parish mission and the theme will be "The Necessity of Letting Go and Learning How to Let Go." There is nothing that sets us freer.


