# Note from the Pastor



"The harvest is great but the laborers are few. Beg the harvest master to send forth laborers for his vineyard." With these words Jesus tells us not just to pray to God, but to beg him for workers in his vineyard. From the earliest days of the

Church there have been presbyters, elders who were set aside (ordained) for sacred duty. The original elders, of course, were the Apostles. We are told in the Acts of the Apostles that their main work was "prayer and the ministry of the Word." That's it. Two-thousand years later that has not changed. As a presbyter in the Church I see my primary holy work is to pray and to make the Word of God incarnate not only in what I say, but in who I am and what I do as a child of God and the head of this spiritual household.

Some time ago, Archbishop Daniel Pilarczyk of Cincinnati wrote a pastoral letter to his people outlining what to expect of his priests. He told them in these days of the priest shortages and the crisis in priestly vocations that we should still expect our priests to be men of God, carrying the Word of God in them and able to celebrate the mysteries of the faith for the people of God. They should expect and demand this of their priests. But they should not expect them to be at every Cub Scout meeting or grade school basketball game or even every meeting of the buildings and grounds committee. Interestingly, what the bishop is saying to his people is similar to what the Apostles said to their community of faith early on. There was no one taking care of the needs of the widows and orphans and no one to wait on tables when they had their community dinners. So the Apostles appointed, and then set aside (ordained), seven who had the heart of a servant to take care of these every day needs. They called these servants "deacons." Their work was to assist the elders in their ministry but primarily to take care of the community. For centuries they served in this capacity and then as time went on, the deaconate slowly began to come into disuse and finally became only a stepping stone to the priesthood. But it always has been and will remain a Sacrament in the Church. It is one of the Holy Orders.

With the coming of Vatican II, the ancient diaconate was restored. Now, men who are married and wanted to serve the Church in a very special way and felt they were being called by God in this vocation are able to present themselves to their church communities for ordination to the deaconate. The impetuous for restoring the deaconate was to help with ministry in the third world where there are so few priests. What happened was that the majority of the deacons ordained came from right here in these United States. The restored deaconate has been a true gift of grace from God for the community of believers. The deaconate has grown exponentially to the point where now in the Diocese of Joliet we have many more deacons than priests. When Bishop Conlon first came to our diocese, he noted that we were deacon rich and priest poor. Well, the church of Joliet and Mary Queen in particular is about to get a little richer. This coming Saturday at the hands of our new Bishop Daniel Conlon, our own Alex Grozik will be ordained a deacon of the Roman Catholic Church.

Alex was raised Russian Orthodox (kissing cousins to Catholics). When he married his wonderful wife Marie, he went through the RCIA process to become Catholic. It took. Mentored through her rock solid Catholic faith, Alex grew in the love and the service of the Lord. Five years ago, discerning along with Marie, Alex felt he was being called to the ordained deaconate. For the last four years, every Monday night and at various intensive workshops, Alex and Marie have been in deaconate formation. Along with Alex, Marie never missed a class. All things being equal, she should probably be ordained with him. All things are not equal. (You do know, however, that in the earliest church there were deaconesses.) After four years of discernment and formation, with a really fine theological education Alex will be ordained a deacon this Saturday at the Cathedral of St. Raymond Nonnatus. Next Sunday, as an ordained deacon, he will preach his first homily.

The Church and Mary Queen in particular has been blessed with some wonderful deacons: Deacon John Maloney, who just recently passed away, served our parish with great distinction and love; our own Deacon Tom Nolan whose beautiful, kind spirit serves us so gently and caringly and will continue to do so with his own minister-bride-to-be, Mimi Wolak (is this a great year for deacons or what?).

The harvest is great, the laborers are few. But they are becoming more and more. For years we have been asking people to pray for vocations and they have. God seems to be answering our prayers, but maybe not in the way that we thought he would. We thought he would send us a whole bunch more priests. That hasn't happened. But what has happened is that our laity have taken most seriously their own ministerial role of service in the community, to the community, for the community. Things that only I could do back in 1970 are now being done better than I ever could have by you, the people of God. There are many ministries in the Church and please God, may there be many ministers.


