

Note from the Pastor



"I like this, Grandpa, this is really good." The voice is that of my ten year old grandson Abraham. He's telling me this as we walk around little Lake Susan nestled in the Blue Ridge Mountains of Montreat, North Carolina. We are on an

intergenerational "Road Scholar" week made up of only grandparents and grandchildren doing what they all love to do... learning with each other, being with each other, enjoying each other.

This is my sixth such trip. I took my oldest, Ange Raphaelle to Paris when she was 19 to stay at the convent where her mother was raised. Her brother Emmanuel, when he was 20, was to go with me and his father to India. He and his dad made it. I got sick on the stopover in Paris and had to return home. When Lewis Anthony (the one who lived with us two years ago) was 10, we went to Yellowstone and did an outward bound type of experience. His sister Ange Gabrielle went with me several years later to the Four Corners to do archeology and dig for Native American Three years ago Azucena and I went to Lexington, Kentucky because the girl was crazy about horses. This year was Abraham's turn. What did he want to do? Climb mountains? Swim in the sea? No, we just spent a week re-reading C.S. Lewis' Chronicles of Narnia, specifically "The Voyage of the Dawn Treader." We acted out parts and helped Prince Caspian and friends help transform cousin Eustace and find the Lost Lords of Narnia. It was all great fun.

And the best part? Being with, participating in and watching grandparents exchange wonderful love and energy with their grandchildren. There's nothing better. The two ends of life are meeting in the middle. One is not yet fully entering into the game of life and the other is on their way out of it. Neither could be called the power elite so immediately they both have something in common. They're both of it. And thank God. How sweet it is. Neither has anything to prove. All they need to do is be with each other, enjoy each other. And they do.

The energy between grandparent and grandchild is so different from that of parent and child. Parents are overwhelmed with responsibilities making both ends meet, disciplining their children and doing all this while going through mid-life. Parents, I pray for you every day! Grandparents... well, grandparents aren't going anywhere. There are no more mountains to climb, points to prove, or image to maintain. They're already reconciled to the fact that they can't do what they used to do. And that's radically o.k. What they can do is be who they are and be present to their grandchildren in a very special way.

From the moment Abraham got in my car for the long trip to North Carolina, I knew that we were in for our own magical mystery tour. Almost everything seen through the eyes of a 10 year old is an adventure — even breakfast at Cracker Barrel with its own little bottles of pancake syrup (he played with them for an hour). The Montreat Conference Center is built like a castle and in the imagination of a young boy, it is a castle and he held the keys to it. From helping Prince Caspian's friends on their journey, to catching salamanders in the creek, to writing and singing sea shanties, it was all magic.

On the day we left, right before we began the obligatory rosary (not a 10 year old's favorite thing) in the car for safe travel, I looked over at him. There he was in all his boyhood innocence and beauty with his eyes closed and a little rivulet of tears streaming down his cheeks.

After a long silence, Abraham looked over at me and said, "Grandpa, can we do this again?" "No," I had to say. "We can do something else, but we can never repeat an experience like this. This was magic."
