

Note from the Pastor



Pete Seeger used to sing a song called, "What Did You Learn in School Today, Dear Little Child of Mine?" To live is to learn and when we stop learning, we stop living.

There are so many things to learn about our world, ourselves and our God that continually enrich our lives. The problem is, however, that most of the stuff, especially some of the really important things, we easily forget. If you do not re-enforce your learning by either repetition or action, the learning either goes dormant or is forgotten. It is for this reason that when I was a teacher, I would continually encourage my students to read the notes from today's class tomorrow and then the day after. Repetitio est mater studiorum (repetition is the mother of all learning).

One of the best techniques I used to re-enforce learning was to ask the students to repeat "I learned" statements at the end of class. What did you learn in school today, dear little child of mine? I learned that... and then you fill in the blank. When I was still a deacon, I remember teaching members of a Presbyterian youth group all about Catholicism. I thought I did a splendid job. At the end of the talk I asked the students to give me, "I learned" statements. I learned that Catholics do not worship Mary. I learned that there are no money slots in the confessional. And one student looked me straight in the eye and said, "I learned that one of your sideburns is longer than the other." (There are all kinds of learning.)

Last week all of the priests of the Diocese (the Presbyterate) along with our Bishop, Daniel Conlon, came together for our bi-annual convocation. It was, and is a wonderful opportunity to spend time with our brother priests, learn something and just relax in the comfortable company of the ones with whom we share so much. On Monday, I was told that most of the Jubilations would be called on to say something at the anniversary banquet on Wednesday. I jotted down some of the things I learned in the last 40 years of priesthood. We never got called on to speak but never being one not wanting to waste words I will share them with you.

So, Father Anthony Richard Michael Taschetta, what did you learn in the last 40 years?

As a young man I learned that life is all about relationship, relationships with my God, family, the people and even myself. The great question then and now is, "Can you relate?" The more I can, the more I am.

As a child, and even an adolescent I thought that life was divided between the good guys and the bad, the right and the wrong, the in and the out. The lines were clear and life was black or white. In midlife I began to discover and I learned that life is not either/ or but both/and. There is a saying that there is so much good in the worst of us and so much bad in the best of us that it hardly behooves any of us to talk about the rest of us. Life is a mixture of the ying and the yang and the tension and balance between them. I learned that perfection is not getting rid of the bad, but incorporating it on behalf of the better. And the best correction for the bad is the practice of the better.

In midlife I also learned the dictum of Emerson was true, "Who you are speaks so loudly that I can not hear a word you are saying." Words both hide and reveal. I am a man of many words and yet the truest revelation of myself (and I only discover myself in so far as I reveal myself) is much more manifested in who I am and what I do than what I say.

For the last ten years I have learned that if something is put forth as absolute truth, unless it carries with it paradox, I don't trust it. Thus I trust that the last shall be first and the poor will be rich and that virgins can give birth. And the greatest truth of all, that mortality and immortality have kissed and made love in the One who is both Man and God.

I learned that everything belongs. In the economy of God, nothing is wasted. Even our sin, and sometimes especially our sins and failings have the power to lead to life. God uses absolutely everything. Nothing is wasted. There are no mistakes in God.

And the greatest learning of all, I learned at the hands of the spiritual masters, the old black matriarchs who trusted in God for everything because they truly had nothing else. And they taught me and I am still in the process of learning how to "let go and let God." It is all I truly need to know and live.

ST. VINCENT DE PAUL CLOTHING DRIVE NOVEMBER 5 & 6


