Note from the Pastor

First Sunday of Advent

Happy New Year! Today is the first Sunday of Advent and everything

old is new again. Now we begin again. There is something very good about new beginnings, a fresh start. And the Church always gives us a chance to do just that. Wash the slate clean (go to Confession this Advent) and start again with your spiritual resolutions. So what's on your agenda this year for the best possible version of you? May I make a few suggestions?

First, pray. The theme for this Advent is, "Prepare the Way... Pray." Pray always. Pray all ways. Most of us think that praying is simply the recitation of Hail Marys and Our Fathers. Well, yes it is, in a way, but saying prayers is not necessarily praying. Praying is simply taking notice of and being aware of the God that dwells in you and more importantly, the God in whom you dwell. I am convinced that most of our problems come from some long held erroneous idea that God is "out there" somewhere and we have to jump through various hoops to get to Him. He has the 'goodies' and if we work hard enough He may, might share them... or not. This is not an easy God to love and in many ways rather toxic. This is the stingy father god who is no god at all. Yet for many of us this is our picture of God. It is not the Abba (father) of Jesus.

Jesus tells us how to pray, "When you pray, go to your room, close the door, and pray in secret." There is no more intimate activity than praying. Here there are no secrets. Here we can pour our hearts out to the Lord. But first you have to go to your room, your inner room. It is the place where we don't even like to go ourselves because so often it's such a mess. Worry not, God can handle our mess. Now, close the door. Shut off all the outside noise that distracts us from hearing the Master when He speaks. And God does speak! We're just not too good at listening; we are way too distracted by the noise in our lives. Truth be told, we look for distractions so we don't have to hear the voice of the Lord gently (and if necessary, not so gently) speaking to us. And God does speak.

But we can't hear, it is almost impossible to be still, quiet down, be silent. Of all the pollutants that invade our lives, one of the most insidious is noise pollution. We are so addicted to the noise of life that we are made uncomfortable by the sound of silence. Try this experiment. The next time you're driving down the highway with your teen and their music is blaring through the speakers, reach over and turn it off. Now watch their reaction. For most, the silence is too much. From the TV to the iPod to the ever present cell phone with its endless texts, our kids have almost no chance at silence. And it is in silence that God speaks most clearly.

They asked the Spiritual Master what the secret of life was and he responded, "silence." And when asked how one achieves silence he responded, "silence." In a colloquy (actually it was a monologue) I once had with the Father about how difficult my life was, as I continued to drone on I swear I heard the voice of God say to me, "Oh shut up!" "How long?" I queried. "About three years." You can't hear if you continually speak and you will never hear the voice of God through all that noise.

So, here we are. Another Advent, a new beginning. Christmas is coming. Advent is all about preparation. So what are you seriously going to do? Prepare the way... pray. Pray always. Pray allways. And one of the best ways is in silence.

AN OPEN NOTE TO THOMAS


Dear Thomas.
