

Note from the Pastor



Prepare the Way...Pray

There is a rather cynical saying when all seems lost that says, "He

doesn't have a prayer." Oh yes he does! As a matter of fact, prayer is all we need and in truth all we really have. So what is prayer? Prayer is becoming aware of, taking notice of, being in communion with the God who dwells in me and more importantly, the God in whom I dwell. You see, God is always there. God cannot not be there. We are not independent agents of life. Apart from God, we don't exist. Prayer is simply being present to that Presence, being aware of it. Embracing it. Loving it. Praising it. Pleading with it. And ultimately allowing it to form us into the person God wants us to be. I don't have a prayer? That's all I have. That's all I need.

The theme of this year's Advent is: Prepare the Way... Pray. But how? There are so many different ways to pray. Saying prayers is one of them. My favorite travelling prayer is the Rosary. I love it because it gives me an awareness that I am not traveling alone. And since the older I get the more perilous travel becomes, it gives me an opportunity to pray for protection, safe travel for all. My most important prayer is my contemplative "sit" for 20 minutes every morning and if I consciously make room for it, every evening. Contemplative prayer is the prayer without words that we were taught last year by Fr. Meninger. I will continue to teach it as I believe it is the highest form of prayer. Here we are not making demands of God but simply being in His presence. Some in the Parish have asked if we can start a contemplative group and this may be a possibility if there is enough interest.

My default prayer, however, my go to prayer is what is called "The Jesus Prayer." It is my favorite prayer not only because it says everything I need to say and everything I need to know and hear, but also because after 50 some years of praying it, it has become one with my heartbeat. At sometime during the day the Jesus prayer will well up inside of me and I will find myself praying it over and over again. In a very real sense I don't so much pray the Jesus Prayer as it prays me. At this point in my life, just as I cannot live without breathing, I cannot truly live without praying. And the

Jesus prayer is as natural as breathing.

I first learned the Jesus Prayer from J.D. Salinger. After being enamored by Catcher in the Rye as an adolescent, I went on to read the rest of his corpus. The prayer is found in his novel, Franny and Zooey. I was about 17 years old when I read it and it really struck me. It comes from an ancient Eastern tradition known as Hesychasm (to keep stillness). response to St. Paul's admonition to "pray always." The prayer, repeated over and over and over again, becomes one with the heartbeat of the pray-er until finally the prayer prays itself. spiritual roots come from the story of the Pharisee and the Publican in St. Luke where the Publican prays in humility saying, "Lord have mercy on me, a sinner." The beginning of the prayer comes from St. Paul's letter to the Philippians. It is a magnificent Christological hymn in which he ends "proclaimed to the glory of God that Jesus Christ is Lord." And so the prayer goes like this:

Lord Jesus Christ, Son of God, have mercy on me, a sinner.

That's it. Sometimes words are added like, "living God," and "miserable sinner" but the basics proclaim the Holy name of Jesus as the Lord, as the Son of God. By the repetition of the Holy Name we are invited into the very presence of the Divine-Human One and then seek what we need more than anything else in the world... mercy. It's all mercy, it's all gift, it's all grace. And it is all undeserved.

Lord Jesus Christ, Son of the Living God, have mercy on me, a sinner. It's all there. And so we prepare the way... we pray. There are many ways to pray and we are called to pray all-ways. One of them is through the Jesus Prayer. I recommend it to you.


