

Note from the Pastor



Poetry and Prayer

If, "in the springtime a young man's fancy lightly turns to thoughts of love," what do they turn to in the dead of the

winter? When the snow falls and the cold comes and it's just too hard to go out to exercise the body, what do you do? May I suggest that you exercise your soul. Pray. And read poetry. The two are quite connected to each other. In prayer we go beyond our little ego selves to be present to the divine Presence. In poetry we try to put into words that which cannot be spoken of: the joy, the mystery, the sorrow, the utter transcendence of life. Both are transformative, both go beyond.

We have just come out of a season where we have listened to one of the greatest poets of all time, the prophet Isaiah. If we read the prophets carefully and ponder what they write and allow it to sink in, you will slowly come to realize that this is pure, unadulterated poetry. Here, let this sink in.

Comfort, give comfort to my people, says your God. Speak tenderly to Jerusalem, and proclaim to her that her service is at an end, her guilt is expiated; indeed, she has received from the hand of the Lord double for all her sins.

A voice cries out: in the desert prepare the way of the Lord! Make straight in the wasteland a highway for our God! Every valley shall be filled in, every mountain and hill shall be made low; the rugged land shall be made a plane, the rough country a broad valley.

The spirit of the Lord God is upon me, because the Lord has anointed me; He has sent me to bring glad tidings to the poor, to heal the broken hearted, to proclaim liberty to captives and release the prisoners, to pronounce a year of favor from the Lord and a day of vindication by our God.

And the wolf also shall dwell with the lamb, and the leopard shall lie down with the kid; and a little child shall lead them.

Shear poetry. Lions and lambs do not lie down together. Virgins do not bear children. Valleys do not rise up and mountains are not made flat. Not in prose anyway. But in poetry? In prayer?

There is a poet in each and every one of us. In these dark days of winter, it would be good to let him/her out to do the fully mystical work it is meant to do: To unite the soul with Eternity. Poetry bypasses the left brain logic of prose and enters straight into the heart of the matter, the soul. It speaks a transformative word that changes us by sitting with it and pondering it. Just like prayer. Several months ago I was handed a poemprayer written by one of our young parishioners, Heather Styka. It makes for good winter pondering and prayer:

Holiday

God's packed up his bags and moved to Coney where he and I rode the Cyclone all night.

He's been going to wars, sitting through boring meetings, needs some time off from incantations. They've been calling him up in matters of state, faxing plans for new pipelines, even though they had promised to keep all that separate.

And God said, Look. Stop calling me. I won't show. I'm leaving steeples for parachute jumps and Steeplechase Park, Deno's Wonder Wheel. No more bureaucratic [bull], I feel like a hot knish and a sprinkle cone.

Tell all the world leaders, and Peter, and Paul, I'm going to Coney to play skee-ball.

Me and God tried to win the ladder climb until my soles were sore. I'd been leaving him voice-mails, waiting for answers, so I nearly tripped over my flip-flops when I first saw him, strolling dirty boardwalks in shorts and big gold aviators, rippling the mirrors in the fun house, shaking up the stars above the wooden roller coasters. I watched him shuffle down to the water and walk across with heavy eyelids, sore hands. This is how I love, said God. Forget about death, I believe in hot dogs and a coke. I give you people soft pretzels, bumper cars, and you still want more answers?

2012 NATIONAL MIGRATION WEEK

"Rise up in splendor, Jerusalem! Your light has come, the glory of the Lord shines upon you." (Isaiah 60: 1)

These words of hope from the Prophet Isaiah speak to a people who have long faced struggles and who seek hope in darkness. We, the Catholic Bishops of Illinois, on the cusp of a New Year, seek to offer that same voice of hope to another people in struggle: immigrant families. The fact that there are 11 million men, women and children in our nation who live in the shadows and are fearful of family separation by deportation is proof that our current system is flawed and our immigration policies have failed us. Let us pray that in this New Year we may recognize the need for comprehensive immigration reform that respects the rule of law, yet also ensures that the law is applied fairly and compassionately to those immigrant families among us who need our help.

How appropriate it is that we celebrate National Migration Week (January 8-14) beginning with the Feast of the Epiphany of Our Lord and Savior Jesus Christ! Like the journey of the Magi following the star to the Source of hope, love and freedom found in the Holy Child lying in the Bethlehem manger, many families are also on a journey seeking hope in a new country. They seek a place of economic, emotional, physical and spiritual security, longing for those things needed to live in human dignity: productive work and fair wages, food, shelter, education, health care, and protection from harm, all too often out of reach in their native land. Yet, under the current immigration system in our country, we see the tragic separation of many of these families. Their hopes turn to despair. But it need not remain this way; we should seek to accompany these families on their journey and support them in their hopes. We should do this because their hopes for themselves and their families are also ours.

Over the months to come, each Catholic diocese in Illinois will be sharing stories of immigrant families who are members of our parishes and communities. They will share their experiences of past and current struggles as well as their successes and hopes for the future. These stories will be shared in diocesan publications, in parish bulletins and on the Catholic Conference of Illinois' website (www.catholicconferenceofillinois.org), as well as other sources. Please take the time to read their stories and learn about the immigration issues that significantly affect your neighbors and fellow parishioners.

We call on all Catholics and people of faith in Illinois to pray for these families and to become those epiphanies: previously hidden manifestations of the Christ within, now revealing to others the deep compassion of Christ through our individual and collective efforts to provide hope and support to immigrant families and to advocate for comprehensive reform of our nation's immigration laws.
