Note from the Pastor



Easter Sunday

And now for the easy part. Resurexit Sicut Dixit He is risen as He said. For the past 30 years or so I have begun every Easter message with this incredible sentence: He lives! He is risen just as He said He would. Oh death,

If he did not rise, according to St. Paul, we are the most pitiable and foolish of all people. But He did. There are witnesses. Mary Magdalene saw Him alive, Peter, James and John saw Him alive. The disciples on the road to Emmaus recognized Him in the breaking of the bread, alive. And we? Why do look for the living among the dead? He is not here. He is risen. Alive!

where is your victory? Oh death, where is your sting?

So how long do you want to live? As a little boy attending my first wake for a little 8 year old girl, I remember begging Jesus to let me live to at least 9. When I was nine I asked for fifteen. At fifteen, I wanted thirty-five. At thirty-five, fifty. At fifty, at least to retirement at seventy. And at seventy? Well, of course, I want to dance and my youngest granddaughter's wedding. How long do I want to live? Forever!

No one wants to die. And yet, and this is what we celebrate big time today, there is no life without death. Rising from the dead is the easy part. It is almost automatic. The hard part is the dying. We continually cling to what is passing away: our youth, our energy, our health... and even our hair. But like all things mortal, they are dying. It is a truism that the moment we are born is the moment we begin to die. Life is a continual process of learning how to let go and it takes a lifetime to learn. The baby clings to its mother, a child clings to its blanket, the adolescent, his or her first love. We cling to our possessions, our power, our prestige. We cling to our children and our parents. We are the ultimate cling-ons.

And yet the secret of life is learning how to let go. Why? Because it is the only way that we will get more life, truer life, deeper life. We can only come into the world when we let go of the womb. We can only enter into school when we let go of our little household world. And so the process goes throughout all of our

lives. How true, how true. The easy part is living, the hard part is letting go and dying.

And the last dying is the most difficult of all. I was recently on the phone with one of my former parishioners who is dying. She is very aware of it and is not afraid. She is, however, very sad that she will be leaving the people she loves. And yet, as she participates in her own dying, she dares to believe that there is something more. We know that we are more than just this mortal form. There is something eternal and divine in us. Our faith tells us so but so also does our experience. In the core of our being, because we want to live forever, (and that desire is utterly universal) we shall live forever. All we have to do is the hard part, to die. Unless the grain of wheat falls to the earth and dies, it remains just a grain of wheat. But if it dies... if it dies... watch out. Resurrection, new life. And today we celebrate that new life. It is the life of the resurrected Christ who tasted death that all might live. He is the first born of the living who will live forever. And so shall we. How? By now you know the drill.

If you want to live, you have to die. And dying is the hard part. But the life that it brings? Ahh, new life. L'chaim. Today we celebrate that life. First in Jesus who rose from the dead, and then in ourselves. We remember those members of our family who have died in Christ and now fully live on the other side of silence. We know that in our own mortality we shall follow, but that is not the end of the story. For we who dare to believe and trust in the Christ will share in His Eternal Life. Why? Resurexit Sicut Dixit. He is risen just as He said! And so shall we.

Alleluia! Alleluia! Alleluia!
