Note from the Pastor



Pentecost Sunday The Feast of the Birth of the Body of Christ, the Church

So, whereja go? Out. Whatja do? Nothing. This is not only the script of the dialogue between ourselves and our teenagers, it is the script sometimes of our very lives. Today is Pentecost Sunday when we celebrate that all of us who have been baptized into Christ Jesus have been given a new life script, a new plan and a new power to live by. It is, as our grade schoolers would say, awesome. It is nothing less than awesome! Sadly, however, so many of us aren't even aware there is another script, there is another way and have consequently never experienced the power (and it is an incredible power) that goes with it. So where do we go? Out. What do we do? Nothing. It's the same old, same old. But it doesn't have to be. All we need do is humbly receive that Spirit and then go boldly to proclaim it and live it.

Last week Jesus ascended into heaven and left His disciples orphans. This week He comes back to them and is reborn not outside of them as He was the first time, but this time inside of them giving them a share in the very same Spirit that vivified Him. God once again comes down from Heaven and is reborn but this time the Body of Christ is not only in the carpenter from Nazareth but also in the people who believe in Him, receive His Spirit and then set out to change the world. Church, that's us!

When Jesus walked on this earth, all of the gifts of God's Spirit were incarnated into One Body, His. He was God walking on earth in human form. In Jesus we have the fullness of God and the fullness of humanity joined together. In Jesus we have the perfect prophet, the perfect healer, the perfect lover, the perfect teacher all joined together in one human body. And through His one perfect act of love, giving His life on the cross for all, He changed history once and for all. He reversed the long march of human self-destruction and turned humanity around so that now there was the possibility to march towards the fullness of life, the kingdom of God. And all we need do is to receive what He had, the very spirit of God. Now all the gifts of God were present in Jesus. Not so with us. When Jesus sent forth His Holy Spirit on that first Pentecost, He poured forth all of His charisms on all of the people but not all received the same gifts. Some received the

gifts of healing, some the gifts of prophecy, some of teaching, others of working miracles and still others administration (ugh!). The genius of God is that everything is given but not given to everyone. This is done so that we become dependent upon each other. No one of us has all the wisdom, all the gifts and, therefore, we need to work with each other, sharing our gifts with each other, for the good of the whole. Now, sharing all these gifts and charisms is called being the Body of Christ on earth. This is *not* a metaphor or a euphuism. This is reality. And if we ever really knew who we were and what we had, look out world. The Kingdom of God is coming. And it begins here and now! Sadly, we don't know it. But we are going to be given a chance to learn.

Do you want to be happy? Dance in your gift, share your charisms. When you do what you do, what you have been called to do, what you have been given to do, you fulfill your destiny. And when you do it, you will be filled with joy. The difficulty is, most of us do not know what to do. We don't know what our gift is or what our charisms might be so how can we know what to do? Why don't we know? It's too close to us. It is so much a part of us that we are blind to it. Usually, someone else has to see it and help us name it. What is your gift? What is your charism? I bet you would be surprised to learn what it truly is. And when you discover what it is, and begin to exercise it, watch it grow. Exponentially. For way too long we have been looking for volunteers to do the work of the Church. We are no longer looking for volunteers, we are looking for disciples. Every disciple has a special gift and ministry for all of the rest. And it is more than just serving the needs of the Church, it's proclaiming the good news through your gifts to the world, to the marketplace, to the place where you work and live. That's where the radical change takes place. That's where the Kingdom of God is ushered in. We all have a rare opportunity to finally hear the voice of God and learn our gift and charism. It behooves us to take advantage of it.

Where did you go? Out into the world. What did you do? By the power and the grace of God's gifts in me, I changed it.

Blessed feast of Pentecost, the Body of Christ incarnate in us, the feast of His Holy Spirit.




