

Note from the Pastor

The Body of Christ All's Well that Ends Well

Today we celebrate the feast of Corpus Christi, the Body of Christ.

Today we bow down not only before the Blessed Sacrament which is, indeed, the Body of Christ, but also we bow down before each other for as St. Paul so eloquently reminds us, we are the Body of Christ. It is often called the mystical Body of Christ but make no mistake about it, there would be no mystical body without the physical body. Paul reminds us again our physical bodies are the temples of the Holy Spirit.

I'm addicted to tobacco. I haven't had a cigarette since I was 32 years old, but if I were to have one today, I couldn't stop. I remember teaching our seminarians while smoking away that they were the temples of God's Holy Spirit. And one of them not so subtly reminded me, "Fada, if you really believed that, you wouldn't be destroying your temple." Convicted! Take care of the temple. That's exactly what I intend to do.

I write this note on a Monday morning after having returned from my morning exercise and ablutions at the Courts. Before I left, I remembered that I had forgotten to throw a bottle of Lucas fuel injection cleaner into the tank of my car. And so I did and thought to myself that this was a harbinger of things to come. Just as the Lucas will clean out my gas line, so today the four liters of Go-Lytely (talk about a misnomer) will clean out mine. Tomorrow morning I am scheduled for my seventh or eighth colonoscopy. Oh, joy. Oh, joy.

In addition to my genetic disposition for baldness I also have one that produces polyps. I come from a long line of polyp producers on my father's side. In 1989 my father died of colon cancer. Five years prior, they operated on him and announced one of the three great lies: the check is in the mail; it's only a boil and I think we've got it all. Well, they didn't. Three years later it came back with a vengeance. Another operation, a colostomy, nuclear radiation at Fermilab (you don't want to know the details) and finally hospice. Ultimately, he died the grace of a happy death but it was a long, long journey. We all know the truism but have a hard time practicing it.

Prevention is always better than a cure. I quit smoking because I truly wanted to prevent lung cancer. I exercise and watch my weight because diabetes is rampant in my family. And given my family history, by the time I was 38 I had my first colonoscopy. They found five polyps. Like I said, I'm a producer.

It's not the heat; it's the humidity. It's not the procedure; it's the preparation! In approximately two hours I will begin downing four liters of polyethylene glycol electrolyte solution (yes, it is as bad as it sounds). You know the saying: They'll get you in the end? Well they certainly will. My only consolation is that by this time tomorrow, I will be sleeping off the drug that will put me in the twilight zone. I remember the first time it was administered to me. It was at the University of Chicago Hospital and it was the days before they started IVs. A saucy African-American nurse was about to give me my shot of Demerol. She pricked herself with the needle. It was the 80's and the middle of the AIDs epidemic. "Oh, dear," she cried after she had injected me and pricked herself. "What's wrong?" I queried. "I just pricked myself with the needle." "Oh, not to worry," I reassured her, "Getting AIDs from me would be akin to the Immaculate Conception." "Why?" she asked. "I'm a priest." She looked at me, scrunched up her face and deadpanned, "Now I'm really worried." And then drug took its effect. At that point they could've put that goofy little hose anywhere they wanted to.

And so tomorrow I go to see the gastroenterologist (not the otorhinolaryngologist. I wouldn't want the hose up my nose). Why do I write all this? Because there are men and women sitting in the pew right now reading this who need to get the procedure done. And you are putting it off. Don't. It is one thing to be the wart on the mystical Body of Christ, you don't want to become the cancerous polyp. And if a lily-livered chicken such as I can do it, so can you.

Take care of that body. It's the temple of the Holy Spirit.
