Note from the Pastor



Many of you may remember Fr. Cyprian Consiglio who, along with my brother Joe, led the music for my 40th Anniversary Mass. This is an article on my visit to his founding monastery.

TRAVELS INTO THE HEART OF GOD

This was the side trip I was really looking forward to. After seeing every ruin in Rome (an old brick is an old brick) it was time to get out of town for awhile. I caught the 7 a.m. "tren-rigionale" out of Roma Termini headed for Arezzo, another medieval walled city, snuggled at the entrance to Tuscany's mini-mountains. From there I was to catch a "trenini" (little train) to Bibbiena and from there a bus to the mountain of St. Romuald, Camaldoli, where his thousand year old monastery and hermitage is located.

I got lucky (graced). Waiting for me at the train station in Arezzo was Fr. Cyprian (Daniel) Consiglio O.S.B., one of my former students who is now a Camaldolese Monk. Many times I had visited him at his home hermitage, New Camaldoli, in the mountains of Big Sur, California (do Catholics know real estate or what?). This time the student was to be the master on this most important journey ... into the heart of God.

In my later years I have become utterly convinced that every thing we do and every where we go is a search for the heart of God. There really is nothing else in life. Now we make lots of detours in this hunt for God thinking that fame, fortune and security will fill and fulfill us. It won't because it can't. There is nothing in this finite passing world that can satiate our infinite hunger for the Infinite. St. Augustine got it right when he wrote "Our hearts are restless until they rest in Thee, O Lord." That's it. That's the secret of joy and happiness and fulfillment. That's the secret of life. There is a God-shaped hole in each of us that can only be filled ... by God. And so the hunt. And so the search.

After the mandatory tour of Arezzo and its many churches, pranzo (lunch) and lots of catching up on each other's life, Cyprian and I headed for Camaldoli. Now driving in any city in Italy is an adventure. The rule is never look behind. You are responsible for only what's in front of you be it bus, car or tourist. And then you

plow ahead. With all the traffic it's a miracle anything moves. But, surprisingly it does and quite well. As we left the city you could feel yourself unwind as the beautiful Tuscan countryside publicly presented herself to us. And as we began to ascend the mountains and the trees' leaves began to show off their magnificent colors, you could feel the power and presence of entering into sacred space and time.

The hermitages at New Camaldoli in California are very simple in a magnificent setting. The monastery and hermitages at Old Camaldoli are magnificent in a magnificent setting. As we walked through the turn of millennium (first, that is) monastery you could feel the presence of the thousands who have walked before you down the same maze of tiny corridors, hidden staircases and ancient musty cellars (in the wine cellar we found huge 700 year old casks still used for aging the wine). It was like something out of "The Name of the Rose" sans, please God, the murders.

The monks welcomed me with warm Italian hospitality. Their house was now my house and what a house. My cell once belonged to a well known local monk-artist and so the walls were filled with wonderful paintings and the piece de resistance, indoor plumbing, my own private bathroom (a rarity in rural Europe). Do these monks know how to live or what?

And they do. Cyprian introduced me to an old monk who is in his early 90's and had been there since he was 9 years old. He spoke of putting on his habit as a small boy and they were beautiful bambini. He obviously remained so because in his ancientness, he was still transparent, still beautiful. There was an aura around him.

The Camaldolese follow the rule of St. Benedict whose model for his monks is "Ora et Labora" (pray and work). I did not have to work during my short stay but I did get to pray. A lot. And Oh, how sweet it is. I joined the monks in choir for office of readings, (matins) morning prayer (lauds) and evening prayer (vespers) and, of course, daily mass. Needless to say it was all in Italian. It was great practice for me. (One of my goals for Sabbatical was to learn Italian. I'm afraid it's not going to happen. In Rome all you need to get by are two elbows and two words: scusi and permesso.)

Note from the Pastor (cont.)

While I loved praying with the monks, most loved was (and is) praying in solitude. Alone, stripped down, empty before God. If the sabbatical has been anything for me, it has been a time of intense (but without tension) prayer. St. Paul admonishes us to "pray always" and like few other times in my life, I have afforded myself that luxury. I am going through all your prayer requests for the second and third time. Through them I have come to know some of you more intimately than when I am frenetically running around serving you back home.

In this year of the Eucharist, the celebration of daily Mass with my brother priests is truly edifying. But most powerful and life transforming for me is the contemplative solitude that my Creator calls me to. And the human initiator of this has been my student Cyprian Consiglio.

Young Danny Consiglio was a 15 year old when I first taught him at St. Charles Borromeo High School Seminary. As a boy he hung on my every word. Now as a man, monk, hermit and master musician, the student has become the master and I am learning from him. Cyprian's life mission, in addition to his own personal holiness and growth in the Lord, is to help make the Lord accessible to all through his own contemplative energy and his truly earthy transcendent music. These he both shared with me.

After morning and evening prayer we would sneak into a hidden chapel for a half hour of silence and contemplative prayer. And one evening he sang for me. My own personal concert of rooted sacred music. And we rested in God. "As a child rests in its mother's arms, so will I rest in You." That's it. That's as good as it gets. That's all there is. That's all we need.
