Note from the Pastor



NEXT TO LOVE

What is the most God like quality we are called to possess? It is love's sister, compassion. God is love. Love

always forgets itself on behalf of the good of the other. But it is compassion that propels love. Compassion comes from the very depths of our being and allows us to experience what the other is going through. It is not sympathy, feeling sorry for or even empathy, feeling their feelings, but something much deeper. It occurs when we allow ourselves to be vulnerable enough to touch the pain and the suffering of the other. And because we have a God who not only embraces but becomes one with our suffering, hurt and pain, it is a most God like quality.

We are redeemed by the passion, the suffering of the Christ. And the passion of Christ comes from His com-passion with suffering humanity. God does not sit on a throne high above the fray of human existence. He becomes one with us in our suffering. Over and over again we read about Jesus feeling from the depth of his bowels... *Compassio*. Compassion for the leper, the adulteress, the multitudes. Somehow compassion seems to be key in the healing of suffering humanity. We cannot heal the dis-ease until we are willing to enter into it with the greatest power in the universe, the power of love.

Today, we seem to be losing compassion. Rather than enter into the transforming power of the pain we willingly anesthetize ourselves against it so that we feel no pain. We all too quickly are becoming a crowd that watches an innocent being beaten up on the street and looking the other way. It is too dangerous and painful to get involved. insulated and isolated in our little world, we go our way. And can you blame us? If we were to feel all the pain of suffering humanity throughout the world, starving children of Sudan, the genocide in Bosnia, Rwanda and now maybe Syria, the enslavement and mutilation of girls in North Africa, and even the pockets of other desolation in Detroit and Camden, places that look like war zones...why...well, we just couldn't take it. It would be too much. Feel that pain of that suffering humanity and you feel the pain of the crucifixion...Oh, so that's how it happened!

Jesus didn't take on our sin as much as He took on our suffering, our mortality, our weakness, our pain. He so identified with suffering humanity that He embraced it with love and it crucified Him. We have a name for it, it is called the Passion of Christ. The suffering of God.

Now, amazingly when our pain and suffering is joined to the suffering of Christ, it becomes not only tolerable but redeemable. Now, the cross, the instrument of torture becomes the gateway to serenity and life. You see, you can't kill God. You can't kill love. Love always gives life. And it is compassion that propels love.

I believe the seeds of compassion are planted in every human being at conception. If the seed is watered and fed it will germinate and grow. If it is not, it will just remain dormant and maybe even seem dead.

It is a given that we are living in dangerous times (all times are dangerous). Humankind always seems to be on the edge of self destruction. And when the other becomes less than human, when we cannot feel their pain, destructive violence The sociopath who committed the exponentially. massacre in Colorado, I am quite sure, could not relate to the pain that he was inflicting not only upon the victims, but their families who will suffer from this for the rest of their lives. The question for us is can we feel the pain? Not only of the sensational, headline grabbers but of the daily suffering and pain that is going on in the south side of Chicago. It is buried on page 8 of the major newspapers because somehow, it is just too painful to look at.

But we have to look. We have to get involved. And we need to teach our children to do the same. How? By following the Leader. He showed us the way, the way of compassion. It is not the way to death but through it to life. And it is always, always ultimately, about life.
