

Note from the Pastor



IT'S ABOUT THE ECONOMY, SWEETHEART

With the Presidential political campaigns heating up and mud slinging at an all time high, it might be worthwhile for us to take a look at

where we, specifically as followers of the Christ, might As a capitalistic country, what does be standing. Christian capitalism look like? Or for that matter, what does Christian socialism look like? (The early Acts of the Apostles seems to have everybody giving according to their means and taking according to their needs with no one in want. Sounds pretty communistic to me.) Probably the best example of a Christian economist in our time was Blessed John Paul II. In his social encyclicals it was obvious he was no fan of totalitarian communism which almost destroyed his homeland. But he was no cheerleader for unbridled laissez faire capitalism either. He saw what it did to the poor. The underlying foundation for John Paul's Christian economics was twofold: the common good and the inherent dignity of the individual. What is the best for all people, not just my people or my tribe or nation and at the same time, how do we maintain the sacredness, beauty and infinite worth of every individual human life. It is quite a balancing act. believe it can be done, however, by what can be called social capitalism.

Now those of you who know me well know that when I am talking about finance, I don't know squat. I am literally incapable of balancing my checkbook. When I look at the monthly reports from our finance committee, my eyes glaze over. Because this is such a personal liability, I take extra special care to surround myself with people who know what they are doing. And that's Mary Queen's outstanding finance committee. Now, while I do not know the ins and outs of finance, I do know one economic principle and I live by it religiously. I exercise it in my personal life and I manage the parishes I am in charge of by it. What is this all encompassing principle? Spend less than you make. Do not live beyond your means. Or as my father said, "Son, if you can't buy it cash money, you can't buy it." He did have an exception to this rule and that was anything that appreciated in value you could buy on time. And so you were allowed to finance a house, or a pipe organ and maybe, maybe education but not that shiny new car you had your eyes on. Start

saving and once you have enough capital, you can now begin to spend some of it.

What is true of financial capital, I also believe is true of social and spiritual capital. When I teach first time pastors, I tell them that when they go into a new parish, they are given so much capital... good will, a willingness to go along with you. I then tell them to be very, very, very careful how they spend it. As a matter of fact, I encourage them not to spend one ounce of good will capital until you've built up even more capital. Every time you ask your parishioners to go somewhere they don't want to go, you spend capital. But every time you visit a person in the hospital, go to a wake, celebrate a funeral well, be available for counseling, be compassionate in taking care of the needs of your people, you gain capital. And when you've got enough, you can begin to spend it. Your people will trust you when you ask them to go to the uncomfortable places that the gospel dictates. lf, however, on the day you walk in you begin to redecorate the rectory, make demands on your people that are costly, you begin to spend what little capital you have and there is a danger of going bankrupt. And once you're bankrupt, you're done. Once you lose legitimacy and trust as a pastor, there's little you can do.

On the other hand, if you are a good steward of the resources that the people have given to you, you can ask for even more and they are willing to go along. It is then that you can begin to do some wonderful things with the financial and spiritual capital you have accumulated.

I'm so proud of Mary Queen of Heaven because we seem to understand this principle. Through your tithes and financial stewardship we have been able to accumulate enough capital to tithe back as a parish for the common good. We are among the most generous parishes to the Walk-in Ministry of Elmhurst. We help fund St. Vincent de Paul not only by our auction dinner/dance but often by direct subsidies when needed. For the past many two years we have looked at the genius of Catholic education especially as it has been traditionally practiced taking care of the immigrant community and the newly arrived. How wonderful to have the capital to help out the children of Holy Family School to give them the tools and resources to become little social capitalists themselves. We pay it forward for the little ones because we have the capital to do so.

Note from the Pastor (cont.)

This coming year, the Parish Council and I are going to spend a good deal of capital in asking us to go beyond our comfort zone in reaching out to our sisters and brothers in the Muslim community. We will never enter into Jesus' plea and promise that "all may be one" until we are willing to go out of our own little cozy world. It takes capital to do that. Social capital. We are willing to spend it because we have it to spend.

It really is all about the economy. And in the great economy of God, nothing gets wasted. Everything is used.

We extend a huge thank you to all of you wonderful men & women and young people too who stepped forward to help. However, we are still in need of some catechists and aides. We cannot start our program without you.

Are you called to be a catechist??

All of us are called to be witnesses to the Gospel, especially in our families and among our friends and neighbors. Sometimes though, we are called in a deeper way, we may feel a deeper desire to share our faith. Bottom line, we are called to be catechists. If you think you may feel that call of the Spirit to do something special for your God, your parish, and most of all our children, please act on it and "call" us at the REO. In responding, you may find that you are doing something special for yourself as well. All sessions meet on Wednesdays. Please bear in mind because of the size of our program we have almost 500 children and over 100 volunteer adults including 70 catechist and aide positions to fill. We are blessed by the number of people who come forward to help. However, we must fill all of our catechist positions before class starts. If you can help, please call the REO today. We do not want to disappoint our children.
