Note from the Pastor



Some songs just get stuck in your head. "Say it with music, beautiful music... somehow they'd rather be kissed to a tune from Chopin or Listz." I have had a lot of songs running through my head recently as our choir reconvenes for a new season and this weekend they are recruiting new members. They too will "say it with music." But theirs will sound more like the Cordetts singing Mr. Sandman. Oh well, whatever sticks in your head. Truth be told, music doesn't so much stick in your head as it does in your "Heart and Soul" (another song).

Music is not so much a function of the mind as it is of the spirit. And spiritual realities cut to the depth of the human soul. Nothing can uplift us quicker or in many ways more profoundly than good music. And nothing can bring us lower or agitate us more than bad. I am still trying to wrap my head around rap. (Maybe that's my problem. I won't let it touch my spirit or soul.)

There are two elements that truly enhance the Sacred Liturgy: good homilies and good music. I remember clearly as a little boy listening to the sermons drag on and thinking I can do better than that. (Ah, the arrogance of a fifth grader.) And the music? Sister Delphine who at the time was 90, played the organ at St. Michael's in Wheaton. Most of us chose to go to the low (unsung) Masses to avoid the pain. That is not to say that there were not some glories to the old Liturgy. The Ambrosian Gloria sung in Latin soared to the heavens and took our spirits with it. The Salve Regina, Panis Angelicus, and Ave Maria are classics (we should still be singing them today). Whenever I celebrate a Benediction I choose to still sing the O Salutaris and Tantum Ergo in Latin. (On Thursday, October 11 we will celebrate a Mass half in Latin and half in English with both the old and new hymns to commemorate the 50th anniversary of Vatican II.)

None of this is to say immediately after the Council music in the Church was stellar. Some of it was god-awful. This was a time right after the folk music craze and everybody and his sister thought that they were folk guitarists so you had ten out of tune guitars playing, "here we are, all together as we sing our song joyfully" in a very bad imitation of the New Christi Minstrals (oh, the pain). Add to this the "lilies of the field" Amen and the echo Our Father and... (I don't even want to go there). But it got better, much better. And what got better came out of the most important gift the Council gave the Church

and that is the full declaration and realization that the PEOPLE ARE THE CHURCH! Gradually the people in the pew began to realize that they too were called to ministry in the Church and administration in her structure. And then came some very fine church musicians (our choirmaster, Ed Novak, among them).

I love good choir music. I love the harmonies, the melodies and the musicianship that goes into it. But what I love even more is good, solid congregational singing. Congregational singing has never been the Catholics' strong suit. When we sing we look like small mouthed bass. In comparison to our Methodist brothers and sisters we pale. But, oh, are we getting better, a lot better. Kudos to you! If you know the song, you are now singing it. And, as St. Augustine so famously said, "He (she) who sings, prays twice." That is not only true on the musical level but on the spiritual level as well. Why? Because music goes to the heart of the matter. It speaks to our heart and soul like nothing else. It is the language universal that everyone understands. And it is worth cultivating.

The Scrooge in me grumbles every month when I write the check for my three grandchildren's piano lessons. The Christ in me knows that it is worth every last penny. Once you have a song in your heart, no one can take it away. It is a music that plays itself on the strings of your soul and it lifts you and fills you like nothing else. As a young man I worked with the profoundly deaf and hard of hearing in San Francisco. I once asked an eloquent lip reader named Jane Louie what was the most difficult part of being deaf? Without hesitation she responded, "Tony, I can't hear music. As a little girl I heard it and now I spend every day trying to remember what it sounded like."

The prayer book of the Church is the Psalms. The Psalms are songs and were originally sung and, therefore, easily memorized as the Israelites worked the fields and tended their sheep. The ancient melodies may have been long lost but the nuns and monks in monasteries continue to sing the praises of God. And the songs touch the depths of the soul.

Today, as we recruit new members for our parish choir, we celebrate music in the Liturgy. Church of God, sing on, sing on.

OUR BELOVED BRENDA SCANLON

“Happy in the eyes of the Lord is the death of His faithful one.” Why happy? Because the death of the faithful always, *always* leads to life. Today we honor and remember one of our local saints, Brenda Scanlon, who went home to the Father last Tuesday and whose funeral Mass we celebrated Saturday. Brenda was not only a long time member of Mary Queen, she was her heart and soul.

For many years she was a Sister of Mercy and when she left the order and joined our parish, she became our Sister of Mercy. She loved children and taught in our RCIC (Rite of Christian Initiation for Children) for years, sat on our Parish Council and in the crisis of losing Liz Lowrey in our Preschool, stepped in to take over. There was nothing she couldn't do because, in a way, she didn't do it. She was simply a transparent vessel of the grace, goodness, love and mercy of God. Whatever she did, seemed effortless because you could see the Hand of God behind all she did. She lived Mary's Magnificat, “My soul magnifies the Lord.”

In the spiritual life, in the journey into the Heart of God, no one gets there alone. The great mysteries of life, we never figure out by ourselves. They are too deep, too paradoxical. We can only see, understand and appropriate them if they have been modeled for us. This is the reason Jesus had to live with His disciples for three years for them to see what He did and how He did it and why He did it. The spiritual life is always counter intuitive and can only be grasped in the concrete when we see it incarnated in another person. Well, we saw it in Brenda in spades. If our holy work is not only to worship the Christ but to become the Christ and then put that light on a lamp stand for all to see, then we can honestly say that all who knew Brenda saw the Christ and how Christ works in the world. Amazing!

But if she was so good and now she is gone, what's so happy about that? Ah, there is the rub, there's the mystery. We've all been taught that death is evil, something to be avoided at all costs. And in the back of our heads, we believe that death is final. It's not. Death is Holy. Without death there is no life. Without the death of the stars, there are no planets. Without the death of the planets, there is no food. If you want the life of children, you have to have the death of elders. Death is creative. It is no less sacred than life. Without the death of Jesus, there would be no life in Christ. And when the holy ones die, they reproduce their life in all those they have touched, in all who knew them. And so through Brenda's death, her life lives on in this community. That's a pretty wonderful thing. It is a happy death. For it always leads to life.

Rest in peace Brenda, your work was well done. And we reap the fruits of your labor. May we do the same.

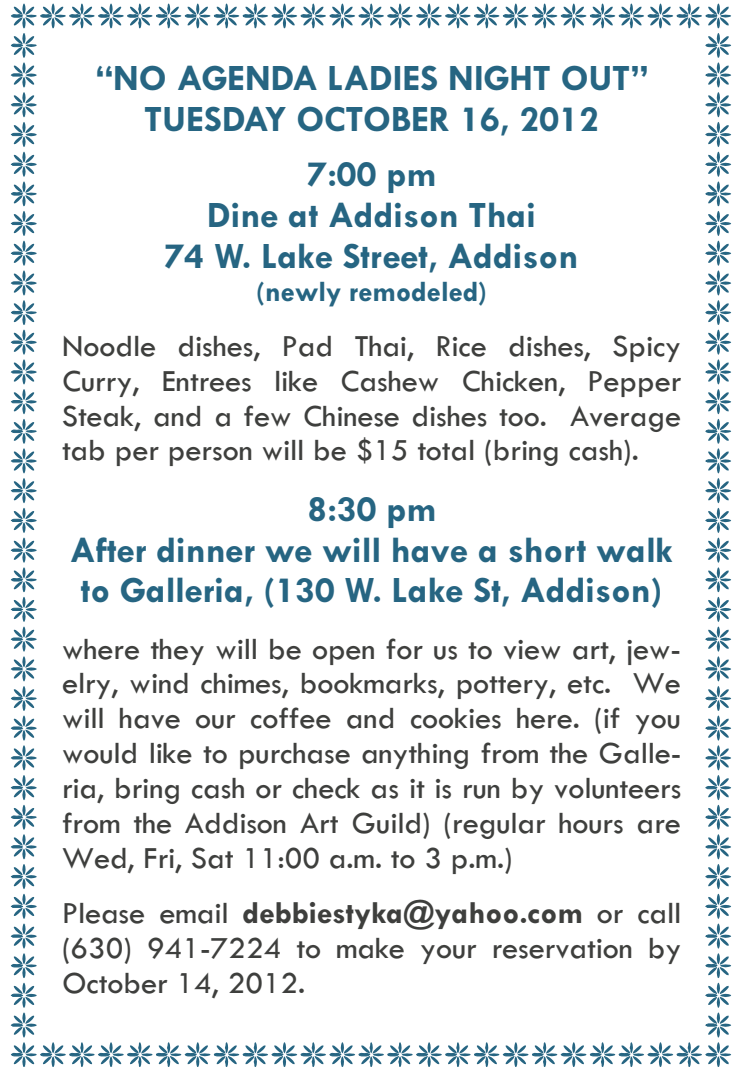
EUCCHARISTIC ADORATION

The Challenge of Forming Consciences for Faithful Citizenship



What Does the Church Say About Catholic Social Teaching in the Public Square? (Part 1)

A consistent ethic of life should guide all Catholic engagement in political life. This Catholic ethic neither treats all issues as morally equivalent nor reduces Catholic teaching to one or two issues. It anchors the Catholic commitment to defend human life and other human rights, from conception until natural death, in the fundamental obligation to respect the dignity of every human being as a child of God. Catholic voters should use Catholic teaching to examine candidates' positions on issues and should consider candidates' integrity, philosophy, and performance. It is important for all citizens "to see beyond party politics, to analyze campaign rhetoric critically, and to choose their political leaders according to principle, not party affiliation or mere self-interest" (USCCB, *Living the Gospel of Life*, no. 33). The following themes of Catholic social teaching provide a moral framework for decisions in public life:

- ◆ **The Right to Life and the Dignity of the Human Person** Human life is sacred.
- ◆ **Call to Family, Community, and Participation**
- ◆ **Rights and Responsibilities**
- ◆ **Option for the Poor and Vulnerable**
- ◆ **Dignity of Work and the Rights of Workers**
- ◆ **Solidarity**
- ◆ **Caring for God's Creation**

The Right to Life and the Dignity of the Human Person Human life is sacred. Direct attacks on innocent human beings are never morally acceptable. Within our society, life is under direct attack from abortion, euthanasia, human cloning, and destruction of human embryos for research. These intrinsic evils must always be opposed. This teaching also compels us as Catholics to oppose genocide, torture, unjust war, and the use of the death penalty, as well as to pursue peace and help overcome poverty, racism, and other conditions that demean human life.
