Note from the Pastor



WOMEN IN THE CHURCH

Two weeks ago, parishioner Maria Race, one of our local Mary Queen theologians and budding mystic stopped me after Mass. She wanted to remind me that last Sunday, the 7th of October, Pope Benedict XVI would be proclaiming Hildegard of Bingen a Doctor of the Church. Hildegard of Bingen? (That's why she's one of our local theologians.) We know of Teresa of Avila, Therese of Lisieux and even Catherine of Siena, Doctors of the Church all. But Hildegard of Bingen?

Yes, Hildegard of Bingen (yes, I know, she sounds like Frodo's mother-in-law). She along with Julian of Norwich have become, in the last 25 years or so, the great-grandmothers of Vatican Council II. So much of their implicit insights into our relationship with the Divine became explicit at the Council. Ironically, it was only after the Council that their writings began to become popular. And popular they are. Even our present Pope is a fan of Hildegard. That's why he's proclaiming her a Doctor of the Church. So what was so special about her and Julian?

Both of them were visionaries. Both of them saw through the political, economic and even theological positions of the time into the Heart of the Divine. Both were aristocrats (one German, the other English) who suffered chronic illness. Interestingly enough in the midst of their illness (vulnerability) the Divine showed and manifested Himself (or in the case of Julian, herself) to them both. And they knew they were intimately connected to God. Their theology was basically the elaboration of the experiences they had of the Divine which resonated in the hearts of their readers.

For Julian it was the realization that "all is well and all matter of things shall be well." God is good and goodness will be victorious. Trust it. For Hildegard, two centuries before Julian, it was her visions of "the way" and now, as Jesus said in the Gospels, "You know the way." Jesus was referring to Himself as the mediator between heaven and earth, mortality and immortality, sin and grace, death and life. Jesus the Son of God, the Divine One, put them

together in His Human Body. Hildegard understood this in her writings called *Vividites* which basically meant "greenness". It was a very early expression of the heavenly and the earthly in an integrating and overcoming of dualisms. She was a true contemplative and mystic. A mystic, a contemplative is one who is able to hold together the polar opposites and integrate them in their very body and being. Hildegard was a master at this. If there is a sickness that the modern world suffers from today it is extreme polarization. Is there a doctor in the house?



Hildegard, while being a woman of God and utterly other worldly, was very much in this world. She, like Catherine of Siena after her, had no problem chiding their respective popes for playing political games. Simony - the buying of political position - was in full tilt during the 12th century (the more things change, the more they remain the same). Hildegard was in favor of campaign financed reform long before the fashion. In putting together the physical and spiritual, Hildegard, as a master musician and very much a woman, wrote about the close association between music and the female body. She was very much into herbal medicine and naturalistic healing. She even wrote an alternative alphabet. She was a renaissance woman long before the renaissance. And even though she lived almost a thousand years ago, she is a model for the contemporary church and especially for women in the church.

As I have written before and truly believe this is not just the year or decade of the woman, it is the century of the woman. As humankind begins to wake up and be conscious that half of its population is female and as that population begins to bring to consciousness its full dignity, potential and power to change the world, it will. It is a transformative power and inherent in the very physical, psychological and spiritual make up of the woman. It simply needs to be modeled and unleashed. And marvelous models such as Hildegard are just what the doctor ordered.

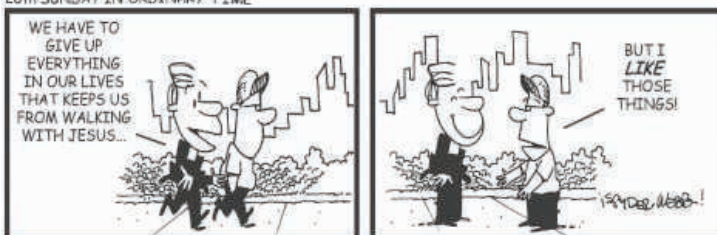
Each participant can practice at their own pace and comfort level with modified expressions of the asanas (poses). Beginners to advanced are welcome.

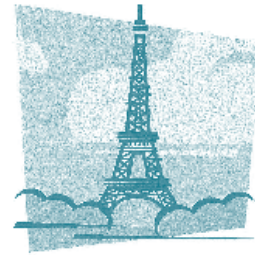

What Does the Church Say About Catholic Social Teaching in the Public Square? (Part 3)

Option for the Poor and Vulnerable

While the common good embraces all, those who are in greatest need deserve preferential concern. A moral test for society is how we treat the weakest among us—the unborn, those dealing with disabilities or terminal illness, the poor and marginalized.

Dignity of Work and the Rights of Workers

The economy must serve people, not the other way around. Economic justice calls for decent work at fair, living wages, opportunities for legal status for immigrant workers, and the opportunity for all people to work together for the common good through their work, ownership, enterprise, investment, participation in unions, and other forms of economic activity.

Solidarity

We are one human family, whatever our national, racial, ethnic, economic, and ideological differences. Our Catholic commitment to solidarity requires that we pursue justice, eliminate racism, end human trafficking, protect human rights, seek peace, and avoid the use of force except as a necessary last resort.

Caring for God’s Creation

Care for the earth is a duty of our Catholic faith. We all are called to be careful stewards of God’s creation and to ensure a safe and hospitable environment for vulnerable human beings now and in the future.

Conclusion

In light of Catholic teaching, as bishops we vigorously repeat our call for a renewed politics that focuses on moral principles, the defense of life, the needs of the weak, and the pursuit of the common good. This kind of political participation reflects the social teaching of our Church and the best traditions of our nation.
