Note from the Pastor



Requiescat in Pace R.I.P

October is the month of the rosary. What a beautiful month. The leaves turn, the air is crisp and football rules. November is the month of the dead. Oh dear, oh dear, what do we do with November?

We remember. We remember those who have "gone before us marked with the sign of faith." We remember our grandparents and parents, aunts and uncles, brothers, sisters and friends. We are, however, beginning to forget. And it is imperative to remember.

Last Friday, All Souls Day, our bereavement ministry called together all those who have lost a loved one this last year to remember. Candles were lit, prayers were said, Mass was celebrated for all who were buried from Mary Queen. But one day is not enough time to remember so we have the entire month. In the back of our church is the Book of the Dead in which we can write the names of those loved ones who now see God face to face and also to remember that we one day will join them. And there's the rub.

As much as we love them, we don't want to join them. I want to live. How long? Forever. Oh, we say that we would be happy to die at 90 until we turn 89 and then we want to up it to 93. What is both amazing and frightening is that we have the technology to keep the body alive that long. Or longer. I often tell our children who are sometimes frightened that they are not to worry. Most likely they can expect to live to be 100 or more. Is that enough? It depends.

There was a time, and not too long ago, when death was considered an integral part of life. But when I ask people in their 80's and 90's today if they thought that they would live this long, almost always they say "no." When they were children their aunts and uncles were dead at 60 or 65. The scenario was often the same. One would get sick, call the family around the bedside and make their amends. All would keep vigil for a while and then they would die. It was a pretty natural process. Read Leo Tolstoy's, Death of *Ivan Illich,* to see how it was done at its best. Today, sadly, there doesn't seem to be a "best practice" for dying. Something is amiss and wrong.

And it goes wrong in that period between, "I'm just fine," and waking up and seeing the Lord eyeball to eyeball and saying, "Hello Jesus!" Most of us want to go to bed perfectly healthy and wake up dead. I've seen that happen only once with my ersatz "grandmother" who lived next door to me when I was a child. At 97, she came down the stairs from her bedroom, lay on the living room couch, crossed her arms, closed her eyes and died. That, however, is a long way from ventilators, and diseases that can be elongated to last seemingly forever. And how long did I say I wanted to live?

Our technology seems to be moving at supersonic speeds. And yet, sadly, in matters of the soul we seem to be going not forward but backwards. As a matter of fact, when it comes to 'soul knowledge', our grandmothers and grandfathers were light years ahead of us. Living close to the rhythms of nature, they understood the rhythms of life. They knew there was a time for everything under the sun, a time to be born... a time to die. And dying always means letting go, and letting go is *always* an act of faith.

Death is an integral part of life. It is not the end of life. In recent years we have made death the ultimate obscenity. We talk about it in euphemisms (they passed away) we cover it up with makeup (doesn't he look like himself) and we spend our entire life savings in the last three months in order to live one month longer. Why? We want to live! Forever. And so we shall.

There is only one way that can happen. And we as Christians know how. There is only one way and that is the way through. If we want to choose the fullness of life, we can only get there through death. It is God's way of things and His Son has shown us the way. He is the Way. Do you believe it? Are you willing to follow?


