Note from the Pastor



On Giving Thanks

This Thursday we celebrate the last unadulterated holiday on the American calendar. All the rest have been

culturally compromised. All Hallows Eve has become a commercial juggernaut and Christmas is still the all time pocketbook killer. But Thanksgiving, outside of the inevitable in-laws' religious and/or political squabbles around the pumpkin pie and decaf coffee, is still pretty pure. It is still about getting together as a family, breaking bread and wishbones together, and giving thanks. For what? Just for, that's what. Just because.

Because why? Because gratitude, even though often buried beneath complaints, anger and sorrow, still has the power, once released, to give life. And it is life not only for the receiver but for the giver as well. I dare say it is impossible to have a grateful heart and be depressed at the same time.

Gratitude is an amazing and powerful thing. Gratitudinem. It comes from the Latin for thankfulness. Gratus. It comes from grace. And grace is never earned, it is always freely given. It is a gift. Our life is unearned, it is given. Love is unearned. By definition it must be freely given or it's not love. And so our holy work this Thursday is to simply take note of and allow from the depth of our hearts and souls gratitude to bubble up for all that we have been freely given. It is unearned. It is grace.

We didn't choose our parents our cultural heritage, the country we were born into, the faith we have grown into. While we are called to cooperate with the grace that has been given to us by work and effort, at the bottom, when all is said and done, it is all gift. It is all grace. And what is the proper response to all of that? To give thanks. To be grateful. And so we shall.

When my parents were alive, Thanksgiving was always at their house. When they passed we moved from my brother's house, to my niece's and finally to mine. For the last four years I have hosted Thanksgiving dinner at the Rectory (I volunteered because I could never figure how to respond to those online e-vites so I figured if I had it here, I didn't have to respond.) My mother was a great cook. Me, not so much. But we do share one thing in common. We both love to prepare a meal and then have the family gather around the table of plenty. My joy is to watch my family en-joy. I do this on an almost weekly basis with my son Luis and his family. To sit down at a meal together, to talk over the day, to kibitz and enjoy each other's company, is sacred. On Thanksgiving it is simply sacred on a grander scale. And with more calories.

By now I have already purchased the turkey and he (she?) is beginning to thaw. By Monday or Tuesday I will be once again googling "cooking the world's best Thanksgiving turkey" to find out what to do. I seem to forget from year to year. One year I soaked it in brine. One year I tried to serve a smoked turkey (disaster). One year I contemplated deep frying but what do you do with all that peanut oil when you're done? There's only one thing for sure that I know I will do. Behold the cooking bag! I have no idea how to prepare the world's best turkey, but don't take away my cooking bag.

In addition to supplying the venue and the turkey, I buy the ham (another cooking bag) and supply the soft drinks and other libations. The rest of the family is responsible for bringing everything else. They all decide what to bring via the e-vite thing. (Actually I did try to respond on e-vite but they wanted my entire family history, what my favorite color was and who I voted for in the last election. It ain't gonna happen.)

On the Wednesday before I rewash all the fancy tablecloths and the la-de-da damask cloth napkins I inherited. I begin to set the table as best I can, sip on a Brandy Manhattan and address the turkey in the refrigerator (Hello, Turkey!). On Thanksgiving morning I make my coffee, say my morning prayers, do the morning ablutions and prepare for Thanksgiving Day Mass. Luis, Leticia and the kids arrive about 8:00 and my *nuera* goes right to work getting the turkey ready. By 9:00am we are all present for the Thanksgiving Day Mass. If you've never been to one, here at Mary Queen it is truly a joy. We open the microphones to share those who have something to be thankful for. And since it is all grace, there's a lot of Thanksgiving.



It is, indeed, a good day. Sooner or later it will turn to religion and politics. Religion is no big deal, we're all of the same faith but politically, oh boy, oh boy. I have one brother a little to the left of Mao Tse-tung and another to the right of Attila the Hun. Me, in medio stat virtu. While we all have strong views most years we manage to keep it relatively civil. This year we should have a lot to talk about.

It is a good day. It is one of the last pure holidays. My prayer for all of you is that you have a wonderful Thanksgiving with whatever family you can conjour up. Whatever we have, is all grace, is all gift. And there is much to be thankful for.



YEAR OF FAITH NOVEMBER REFLECTION

God, the Father Almighty, maker of heaven and earth...

- **Ponder this** from the <u>Catechism of the Catholic</u> <u>Church</u>: "If God is almighty 'in heaven and on earth,' it is because he made them. Nothing is impossible for God. He is the Lord of the universe, whose order he established and which remains wholly subject to him and at his disposal." (CCC 269)
- Prayers: Be attentive to the physical world; meditate on the sights and sounds around you. How is it changing at this time of year? How does that make you feel? Can you see God present in the more stark environment? Read a biography of St. Francis of Assisi who is the patron saint of ecology.
- Read/Discuss: The stories of creation, Genesis 1 and 2: How do you feel about the idea that YOU are made in God's image? How do men and women continue the story of creation even today?
- Action: Re-commit to recycling. Try fasting from electricity for one hour and consider alternatives to Christmas wrapping paper.
