

# Note from the Pastor



# **Viva Cristo Rey**

Old Abbott Ignatius of St. Meinrad Archabbey was fond of taking visitors up to the top floor of St. Bede

Hall, climb up to the roof garden and have them look in all directions at the beautiful rolling hills of southern Indiana. He would then proclaim in his gentlemen's Tennessee drawl, "As fah as the eye can see, I own." Now, there's a king proclaiming his kingdom! He was the sovereign of all he could behold (at least from a rooftop).

Today the Church proclaims that Jesus, the Christ is the King of the universe. It is the last Sunday of the year and she shouts from the rooftops that not only has Christ come 2,000 years ago and is present among us today in His mystical Body, but He shall return as King to proclaim, "As fah as the eye can see, I own." That's a long way from His humble beginnings in a manger filled with straw in a cold and drafty barn. That is a very, very long way from dying naked on a cross outside the Royal City, outside the law. So why a king?

Because a king rules. He is sovereign over His kingdom. And His kingdom is the entire universe and all that is in it. It is a kingdom without boundaries; a realm that never ends.

This is all rather strange since the God of Abraham wasn't too keen on kings. When the Israelites petitioned the Lord to have a king of their own so they could be like other nations, God said, are you sure you want to do this? Oh yes they did. And so they had a petty Saul, and adulteress David, and a king Solomon who in his dotage with his hundreds of concubines was anything but wise. And from there it got worse. Why? Because they were the wrong kind of kings. They were kings who wished for Israel to dominate and therefore for them to be on the top of the domination heap. And even though Jesus came from a line of kings in the house of David, He was not to be of their ilk.


He came to the Royal City riding on the foal of an ass. And while the crowds sang Hosanna to the Son of David, He knew that the crowds would turn on Him the moment that they discovered that He was not the political king they wanted. He was not to be the king

of dominance, but the king of hearts.

"Are you a king?" Pilot rhetorically asks. And Jesus responds, "You say so." Indeed He is a king but His reign is not over land and might. It is over the human heart, the locus of love. He is king because He is love incarnate and has the Midas touch to turn everything He touches into love incarnate. That's us. This is the king who does not dominate, but liberates. For those who allow themselves to enter into His kingdom, there is a surety and security that this world cannot give. For those who choose to live in His realm and seek His kingdom, there is the fullness of life.

And so today we shout, Viva Cristo Rey, Long Live Christ the King. Two-thousand years ago the fullness of love dwelled in human flesh in the man Jesus. That same love is now spread throughout the world in the mystical Body of Christ. And when that love becomes fully incarnate in all of human kind, Christ will have come again, in glory. Long live Christ the King.


