

Note from the Pastor



Wondrous Days of Hope

Ever since Uncle Walt invented the concept over fifty years ago at

Disneyland, everything now has to have a "theme". Weddings have themes, birthdays have themes (on my 50th birthday the theme was, but of course, The Fifties. Oh, the poodle skirts and the DA haircuts – for those who had hair.) And these days even our liturgical seasons have themes. Today we begin the first Sunday of Advent and, of course, the over arching theme is the preparation for the coming of the Christ. Within that there is a sub-theme. This year our liturgy commission has chosen the theme of "Wondrous Days of Hope."

Hope is in the middle of the cardinal virtues of Faith and Love and like any middle child, often overlooked. Love is the king, Faith is the queen and Hope... well Hope is more difficult, harder to define, nebulous, and always in the future. Hope is eager expectation that something good is coming or will happen. And it almost always excites and gives life. The old woman who places her \$2 bet and watches her nag run around the track for two minutes is filled with expectation, hope and life. As the adrenaline flows she can only imagine how wonderful it will be to win. But the odds are not in her favor. Nor are they for the ultimate chump bet, the lottery. You know you are going to lose so why do you play every week? Because for the time you are waiting to see the numbers, you play in your mind how wonderful things are going to be and what you are going to do with all those riches. And then you read the numbers and, of course, you lose. Is there a safer, better bet? You betchem.

Today is the first Sunday of Advent. It is the season of high expectations and great hope. While we will commemorate and remember the birth of baby Jesus, the one we are waiting for and hoping for is the cosmic Christ whose riches of peace, prosperity, health and love are inexhaustible. In His great coming we eternally hope. But how are we to hope?

We are to hope like Mary. Growing up in a household with her parents Joachim and Anne, her aunts and uncles and cousins and all of her extended family, her life was good. But she knew there had to

be something more. She heard the stories of how it was going to be when the Messiah came. He would usher in peace, prosperity and a freedom to worship their God as they wished. The young virgin was filled with Wondrous Hope. And then came the angel.

And the question. "But how is this to be since I know not man?" The angel told her. And Mary's response? The most stunning word ever spoken by a human being, "Fiat," let it be. I do not understand, it is beyond my comprehension, but I will trust. Let it be. And I will make room. There is room in my womb for love. Let it be born in me. How do we prepare for this wondrous hope that continues to sprout in our hearts? By trusting and making room. Trusting and making room. Like hope itself, this process of trust and emptiness springs eternal.

This coming Friday and Saturday we will celebrate Mary's mother, St. Anne doing just that. She too trusted in the Lord and made room for a baby who was to be Immaculately Conceived. Baby Mary was the very first of our kind conceived and born without the stain of Adam's sin. She was not subject to the original shame of our first parents and therefore was able to say her "yes" to God and to make room in her womb for the one who was and is and forever will be God's eternal "yes" to us, Jesus the Christ.

So how are we to hope this Advent? By trusting and making room. It is almost impossible to receive the new when we are filled with so much of the old. It is time to sweep our house clean of all of the old angers and resentments, hard thoughts that never leave us and even ideologies that we have been clinging to so we can make room for something new to be born in us, to create a brand new dwelling place for the Divine. We have a chance to ritually do that in a most wonderful way this coming Friday evening.




