

# Note from the Pastor



#### **Prophets Among Us**

This holy season of Advent, the season of the coming of the Lord, is

also the season of the prophets. We often think of a prophet as one who tells us the future. Last week we heard from the prophet Jeremiah who told of one coming from the house of David to be the Son of Righteousness and because of Him, "In those days, Judah shall be safe and Jerusalem shall dwell secure." (We're still waiting.) A Biblical prophet, however, is more than just a soothsayer. He is much more a truth teller and speaks in the Vox Dei, the voice of God. He, or she, will often begin by saying, "thus says the Lord..." Most often the message is tough to hear (that's why we kill the prophets) but it is always liberating.

When we think of the prophets we think of Old Testament figures like Isaiah, Hosea, or Jeremiah but in truth, prophets are still among us today. And we still get upset by their messages. Yet, if we can listen, they can change our lives. Modern day prophets may be famous like the Berrigan brothers or living next door to us. They may not even be conscious that they are prophets or even speaking for God but you know that they are real when what they say cuts you to the core, unmasks your illusions and reveals the truth. And the truth will set you free (but first it will make you miserable). One such prophet in my life is my spiritual director, Fr. Ray Lescher. I cannot encounter him without coming back a little more bloodied, a lot more humbled and much freer for having my illusions dispelled and the truth about myself revealed. Another such every day prophet lives in my own household. His name is Clarence Edward Knudsen, also known as "Butch".

I first met Butch while pastoring at St. Theresa in Kankakee. His daughter attended our local Catholic grade school and Butch attended nothing. I brought this to his attention and immediately he began to weekly attend Mass and to contribute to the needs of the parish. I later learned that his wife, Andrea, was bed-ridden with Multiple Sclerosis and he took care of her every need. He was the first person in my 25 years of priesthood at the time who actually paid back a substantial loan in full. In short, while a bit rough

around the edges, here was an honest man. You might not always like what you see, but what you see is what you get. When I moved to St. Isidore in Bloomingdale, I invited Butch to come to live in the attic of our old church to be our night watchman (Shades Of Quasimodo). This allowed him to live closer to his bride so as to visit her every day. When I moved to Mary Queen, guess who came along?

For those of you who know Butch you know that he is a first class curmudgeon. What comes into his head comes out of his mouth without a filter. When you hear his preface, "Now, I don't mean no offense by this but...," look out. You are going to get it with both barrels. And much of the time it is not just his opinion. He has struck a cord and truth deep within. He's a pretty good reader of people and once in a while his read rises to the level of prophecy.

This is what happened several years ago during his walking the grounds of St. Isidore. Every day, after visiting his wife, he would come back to the parish to check things out. At this time, at least twice a week a young woman would come to the office to have Butch unlock either the chapel or the church. The moment she walked into the church door she would burst into tears. An hour later she would walk out as sad as she walked in. This went on for almost a year. And then it was time.


One day, out of the blue, Butch knew it and he sensed that she knew it and so he spoke. "I don't mean to pry, lady, but for almost a year now I have been unlocking the church or the chapel for you and everyday you come in crying and walk out crying. May I ask you, what's your problem?" She was a young and beautiful woman in her 20's and as she spoke the tears began to flow again. Several years

before she lost her three year old child to a sickness And even though she had no control over it, her husband blamed her for the child's death. Every day she came filled with regret, remorse and guilt. And there was no end in sight. "May I say something? I don't mean no offense but you are right. You really do have a problem. And you are wrong. You don't need to carry this on forever. I know you feel bad for the loss of your child and for that I am truly sorry. But you have no business taking on your husband's accusations because you did all you could for your baby. And let me tell you about your little boy. He's fine. He's in Heaven with Jesus and no more harm can ever come to him. Now, do you honestly think he wants to see you coming in here day after day crying your eyes out destroying your life for something you had no control over?" And then he went on, and on and on... for 20 minutes. While his words were hard, they were said with a truth and a love that seemed to be sinking into the heart of this young woman. When he was done, he finally said to her, "Honey, it's time to come off the cross. Someone else needs the wood." She looked at him with a peace that he never saw in her before. She hugged him and then she left. He never saw her again. Had Butch tried to speak to her six months earlier, nothing would have happened. Had he done it two days later, who knows. All he knew was that it was time. And timing is everything. As the old saying goes, "God might not be there when you want Him, but He's always on time."

Some people think that revelation is over and that God no longer speaks to us. Of course He does. He speaks to us through the ancient prophets like Baruch in today's second reading, "Jerusalem, take off you robe of mourning and misery; put on the splendor of glory from God." And He speaks through the everyday prophets. They are all around us, they may even be living in our own household. Sometimes they mumble gibberish and you will know it. But when the time comes for something you need to hear that will liberate you, listen. It may be the voice of God hidden in a curmudgeon.






