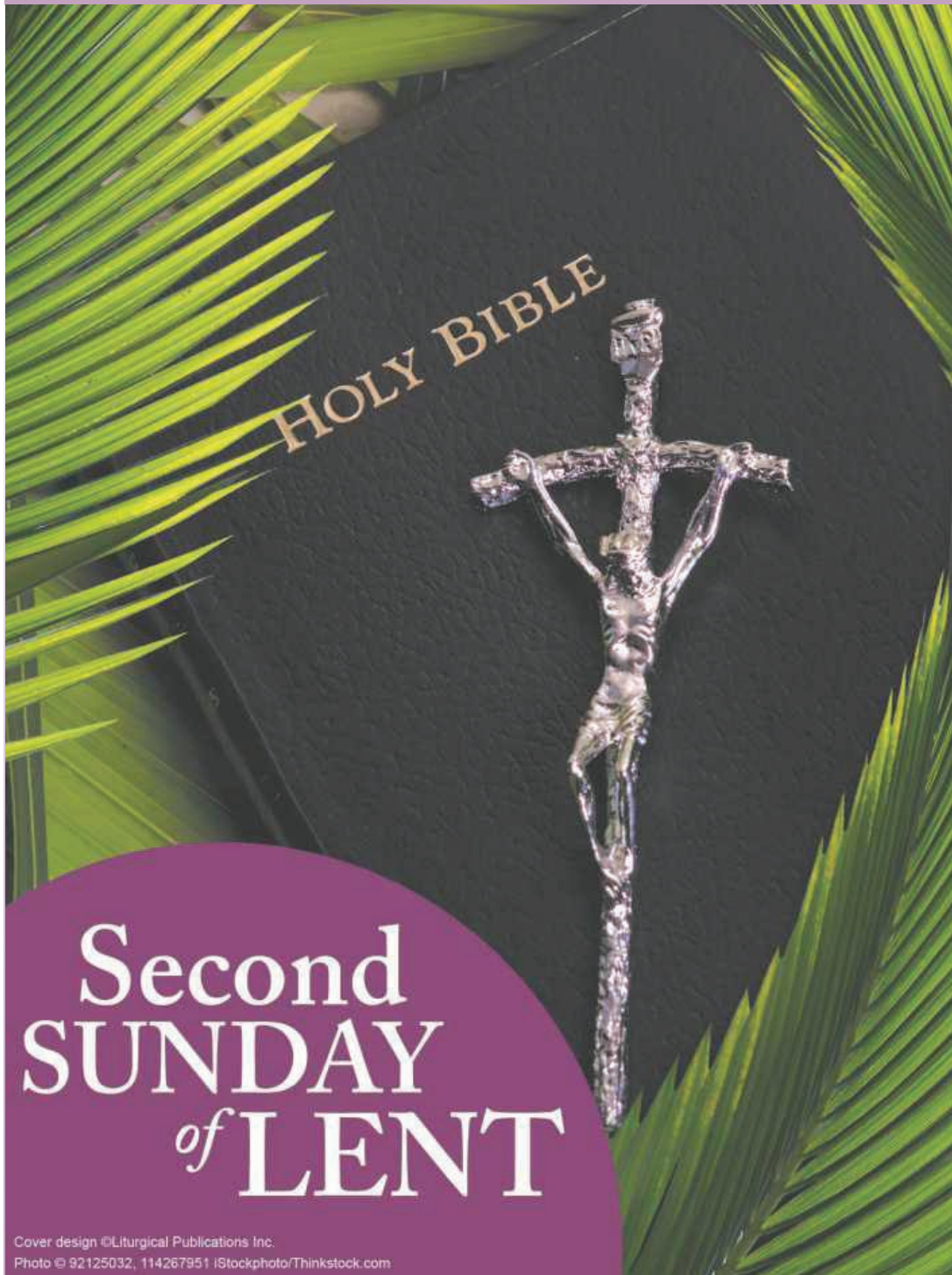

Note from the Pastor



Remembering John Powell, S.J.

“But we have this treasure in earthen vessels so that the surpassing greatness of the power will be from God and not from ourselves.” With these words to the Corinthians, St. Paul makes clear that the power that comes through him is not his. He and we are but clay jars that are often cracked and leak but nonetheless hold an untold wealth and power that comes not from us but from God. St. Paul, I believe, was born an obsessive compulsive neurotic and died that way. This is at once both humbling and liberating. Our Holy Father, Pope Benedict XVI, fully realizing his own fragility in an amazing feat of adult humility becomes obedient to a power that is beyond him, the power of the Holy Spirit. His frail body and mind are both going to fail and the redemptive Power that goes through him will, please God, increase and transform the lives of millions. As St. Paul put it, “in my weakness is God’s strength.”

Former Dominican priest, Francis MacNutt (himself a man with clay feet) would often tell the story of a Pentecostal preacher who had an incredible gift for healing. This gift, however, was incased in a man who was a degenerate, raging alcoholic and drug addict. As Francis told the story, this preacher would stumble into a church totally gone and amazingly five minutes before he was to go out to the people sobered himself up enough to walk out, pray, and heal the multitudes. As soon as he was done he would go to the back room and resume his stupor. The point was that the magnificent gift was housed in a very frail and broken man. A physician who could not heal himself. The other point was that the gift was not for him or even about him. It was about the people whom he was called to serve. This is both humbling and liberating.

Last week I published in the bulletin one of my favorite stories from one of my priest mentors, Fr. John Powell, S.J. It was the wonderful story of “Tommy” who never found God, but had God find him.

I first encountered Fr. Powell on an old reel-to-reel-tape that someone gave me of a conference he had

given. I had just been ordained a deacon and was asked to give the high school Senior’s retreat for the jocks of Providence High School in Joliet who missed the regular retreat. Talk about a tough audience. I remember my first conference with them when I asked what they wanted to do in life. One huge muscle bound senior looked at frail little me and proclaimed, “When I get outta here, I’m going to find me a woman, get me a job at Seiko Steel and have me a twiddle of kids.” I knew it was going to be a very long weekend.

And then I heard Fr. Powell. As I listened to his tape that night I was thunderstruck, awestruck. I was like a bobby-soxer listening to Frank Sinatra. I had never heard any priest preach or teach like this before. He was human. He was funny. He was insightful. He was so easy to listen to. And that night he became my model on how I wanted to preach and teach. If imitation is the highest form of flattery, Fr. Powell should have been very flattered by my “performance” the next day. I confess that I stole not only his manner of speaking, but also a lot of his material. A few years later when I wrote to him telling him of how much I admired him and used and stole his stuff, he wrote back saying, “Not to worry, the goods were hot when I got them.”

Needless to say, Fr. Powell was put high on my pedestal. I listened to all his tapes, read his books, went to his priest retreats. When I was in Hopkins Park, I invited him to come out and speak to our people. I remember announcing that next week John Powell was coming to speak to us to which they responded, “John Paul! Father’s got the Pope coming.” Well, not quite. But he was good. It was one of those very magical nights. It was right around this time that Fr. Powell took a leave from his regular teaching and preaching and did nothing but speak about pro-life. To this day, his anti-abortion argument for me still speaks the loudest. He said that the issue was one between a big person and a little person, one who had power and one who was powerless. Should there be any doubt in anyone’s mind, who is a follower of Christ, as to which one should have preference? Pretty simple argument, pretty profound.


Note from the Pastor (cont.)

As the years went by we lost contact. He got older, retired from teaching at Loyola and disappeared from the scene. Then one day several years ago, shortly before he died I read that he was accused of sexually abusing a number of co-eds at the university. Were I a young man I would have been crestfallen but having been around this terrible block of priestly abuse for the last 20 years, I was simply heartbroken and terribly saddened. But I am afraid, not surprised.

In Jesus' strongest terms he condemns those who scandalize the little ones. The Greek word *skandalon* means stumbling block. What a stumbling block and wounding agent he must have been to these young ones under his charge. Spiritual-sexual wounds are almost incurable. And my heart sank for his victims. And I prayed for their healing. But my heart also saddened for him, a clay pot, and earthen vessel, terribly flawed and yet a messenger from God... a fallen angel.

We're in the Holy Season of Lent. It is the time when we are called to do what is hard and what we would rather not do. What is most hard is to carry the cross, to bear the pain, to bear the pain of the victims, to bear the weakness and sinfulness of the perpetrators, to bear the suffering of humanity. Oh, how simple life would be if it was just black or white, good or bad. It's just not. And so we carry the treasure in an earthen vessel. And for now, on this side of eternity, that has to be enough.

EUCCHARISTIC ADORATION

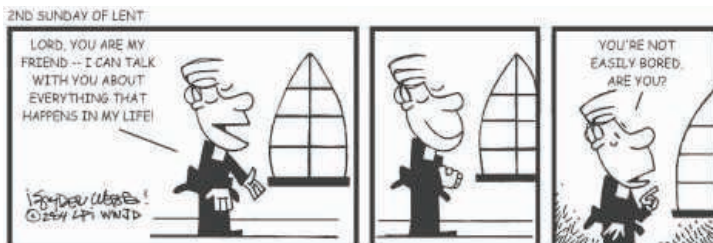
