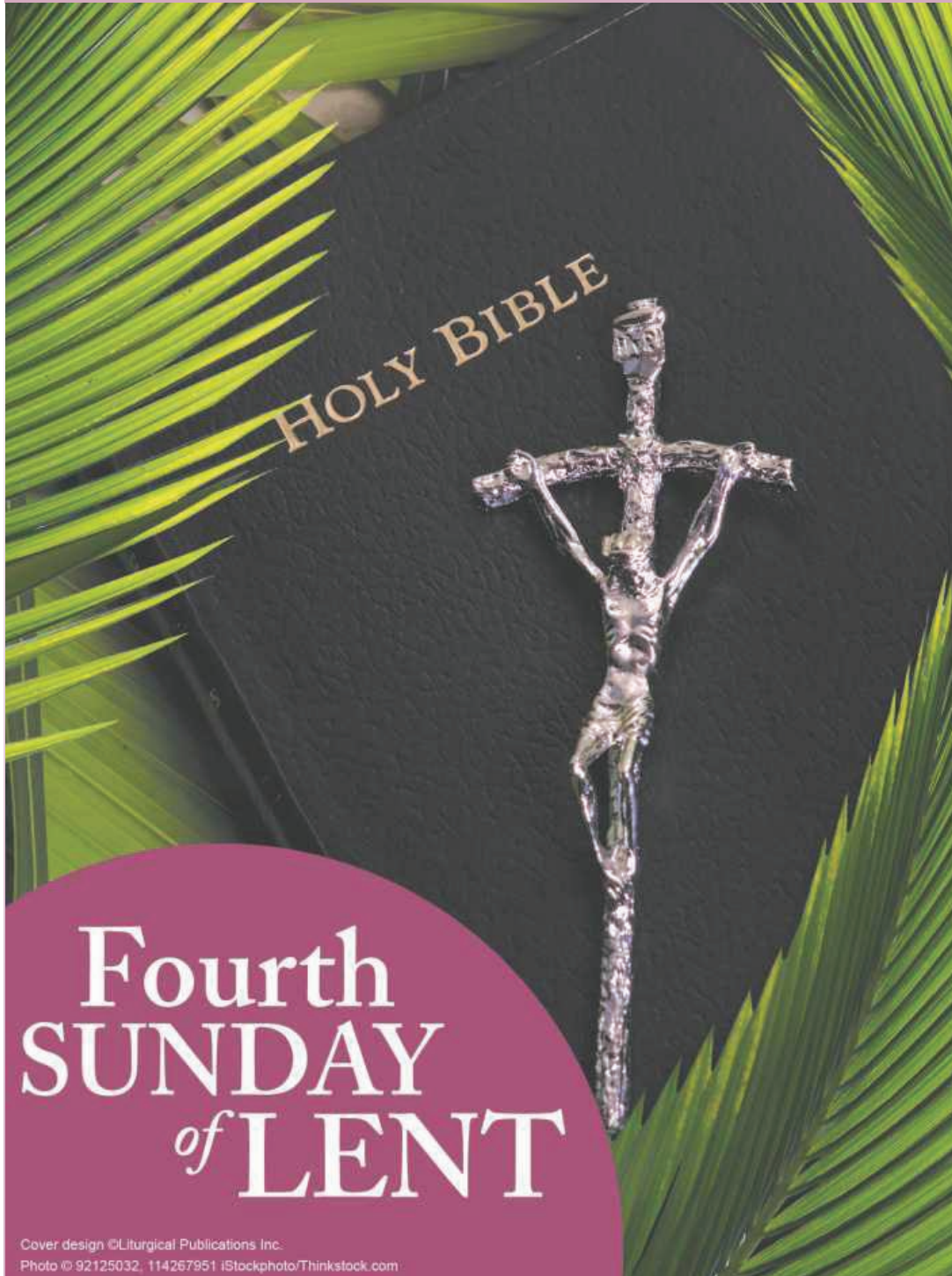

Note from the Pastor



Letting Go Gracefully

There is a saying that, "The hardest thing for anybody to say in 25 words or less is, 'goodbye'." It used to drive me crazy as a little kid when my parents would be leaving a wedding reception saying goodbye to all the relatives. It took forever! But then, saying goodbye always involves a leaving, a separation, a letting go. I have come to believe that "letting go" is the hardest thing we must all learn to do... and the most indispensable.

As I have said so many times, everything I ever needed to know about God, life, relationships and death is contained in the old saying of the black matriarchs, "Let go and Let God."

I have watched many a tear flow from a mother's eyes as she let go of her little one going for the first time to kindergarten. And sometimes it's even worse when she has to let them go for college. If we love, we tend to cling and yet true love is always about letting go. But how? How do you do it when every instinct and every fiber in your body wants to hold on? The truth is, without a model, without seeing it done in practice, it is almost impossible to let go.

We do, however, have a model. We have a super model. We have right before our eyes one who has been endowed with supernatural gifts and powers and with a profound act of humility and grace he has let it all go.

He is Benedict XVI, the now Pope Emeritus. And he is preparing for his ultimate letting go of the mortal life we so jealously cling to. Oh, would that the Castro brothers and Assad not to mention a whole lot of others would follow his lead. So much pain and suffering is caused in the name of holding on. And not just in the political sphere but in all areas of life. I dare say that most of our pain and suffering comes from refusing to accept reality as it is. And the tragedy is that in trying to reconfigure the world according to my vision of it, that to which I am clinging, I cause ten times more pain for myself and others.

From the time we are little children we are given the opportunity to let go of little things in preparation

of letting go of the biggest... our mortal life. And here we have the ultimate model of letting go, our Lord, Jesus. "Tho He was the in the form of God He did not deem equality with God as something to be grasped at rather He *emptied* Himself." In the first half of life we gather; in the second half we scatter, we let go. And the secret is to let go gracefully. The sadness of our culture is that it is not teaching us to do that. Instead we go into this night kicking and screaming and holding on to every last option to keep our body alive. How sad. We have all heard horror stories of procedures being done at the end of life just to give us another two months or six weeks or four days only to have us die in the end with more pain and suffering. Now, don't get me wrong, I'm not against medical intervention if it's going to truly add to the quality and quantity of life, or if it is going to relieve pain and suffering. But if it is only because we cannot let go... well... there has to be a better way, and there is. Next week, I'll share that way.

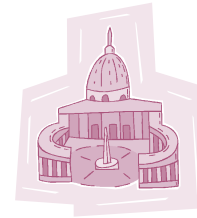

MONDAY MARCH 11 AT 7:00 PM

This Monday St. Joseph Parish, Addison, welcomes Fr. Steve Bevans. Fr. Steve's presentation is titled: **"Big Perspectives on a Big Meeting: An Introduction to Vatican II"**.

This talk will focus on the meaning of an ecumenical council, offer some reasons why Vatican II is similar and yet quite distinctive in terms of past councils, and offer four themes that run through the Council: aggiornamento, resourcement, development, and literary style.

Reconciliation will be available. Fellowship and refreshments will follow the presentation.

Fr. Steve Bevans, SVD is a priest of the Society of the Divine Word (SVD) and serves as Louis J. Luzbetak, SVD Professor of Mission and Culture at Catholic Theological Union in the Hyde Park neighborhood of Chicago, where he has taught for twenty-seven years. He has studied at the Pontifical Gregorian University in Rome, and at the University of Notre Dame, where he received his Ph.D. in 1986. Fr. Steve has published six books, and has taught and lectured around Chicago, the United States, and in many countries in the world. He has taught courses on Vatican II at Catholic Theological Union, and this past fall semester he coordinated an eleven-part lecture series on the Council.
