Note from the Pastor



Who Made You?

Do you remember the old Baltimore Catechism?

First question: Who made you? Answer: God made me.

So far so good.

Question #2: Why did God make me? Answer: God made me to know, love and serve Him on this earth and to be happy with Him forever in Heaven.

Well, close but no cigar. That is not quite why God made us. Knowing, loving and serving God are an indispensible part of the equation but they are all predicated on a prior, free action of God. And in the Divine conversation, God always speaks and acts first.

Why did God make me? Because if the major mystical definition of God is love, then love always needs an object beyond itself. For the lover to be a lover it needs a beloved. Hence, the Trinity, three distinct persons in an eternal dance of love.

Many of the mystics and saints of old have talked throughout history that God created because God needed something to love beyond the internal love of the Trinity. This self-sufficient eternal love still has to go beyond itself. And so, the argument goes, God created humans so that one species could love God back freely. Machines cannot love. Trees cannot consciously love, at least in a way that we understand consciousness. Trees give glory to God by simply being a tree. That's their response. We, on the other hand, can consciously choose to give love back. To know, love, and it's logically corollary, to serve is our human response to God's love. But it must be freely given. It cannot be coerced.

If all this theological gobbly-gook doesn't make sense, try this human parallel. It is our relationship to our own children. Our deepest desire, maybe not conscious desire, if we consciously conceived a child was to bring forth a love object. My deepest desire is to love this child in every way that I possibly can and hope (and I

can only hope, I cannot force) that the child will love me in return and amazingly enough, the way I love them becomes their empowerment to love me back. This pattern can be applied to God and us.

The reproductive pattern is a given to us humans in a unique and special way so that we can experience the reciprocal character of love. God creates an object of love that God can totally give himself to so that we will eventually have the ability to love God back freely in the very same way. And just as there are ungrateful children for the love that their parents give them, so there are ungrateful children of God who do not love back in the same way. The operative word here is "free". Love that is freely given without strings (but with a great deal of hope) can only be freely reciprocated.

So what is our holy work? Our work is to take stock of how we have been loved, by both our parents and our God that enables us not only to love in return but to pass on that love to those who follow us until love has conquered all.

And now we know not only who made us but why God made us. Let us bask in that love, return it and pass it on.

Diocesan News



April is national **Child Abuse Prevention Month**, appropriately during the Easter season. There is no better time than Easter to celebrate the protection of our most valuable gift from God – our children.

The Diocese of Joliet has asked that we share with you *Ten Points for Protecting Children*. Today we are sharing the fifth to eighth of these ten points.

- 5. The residual effects of having been abused can last a lifetime. Those who have been abused seldom "just get over it." The sense of violation goes deep into a person's psyche and feelings of anger, shame, hurt and betrayal can build long after the abuse has taken place. Some have even described the feeling as if it has "scarred their soul."
- 6. Feeling heard leads toward healing. Relief from hurt and anger often comes when one feels heard, when one's pain and concerns are taken seriously, and a victim/survivor's appropriate sense of rage and indignation are acknowledged. Not being acknowledged contributes to a victim's sense of being invisible, unimportant and unworthy; they are in some way "revictimized."
- 7. You cannot always predict who will be an abuser. Experience shows that most abuse is at the hands of someone who has gained the trust of a victim/survivor and his/her family. Most abuse also occurs in the family setting. Sometimes the "nicest person in the world" is an abuser, and this "niceness" enables a false sense of trust to be created between abuser and abused.
- 8. There are behavioral warning signs of child abusers. Training and education help adults recognize grooming techniques that are precursors to abuse. Some abusers isolate a potential victim by giving him or her undue attention or lavish gifts. Another common grooming technique is to allow young people to participate in activities which their parents or guardians would not approve, such as watching pornography, drinking alcohol, using drugs, and excessive touching, which includes wrestling and tickling. It is also critical to be wary of age-inappropriate relationships, seen, for example, in the adult who is more comfortable with children than fellow adults. Parishes can set up rules to guide interaction between adults and children.


