Note from the Pastor



Come Holy Ghost

Today is Pentecost Sunday. I hope you remembered to wear something red for our birthday. Today we celebrate the beginning of a brand

new life. Those who had been locked up zombie like in an upper room were set on fire with a brand new spirit. God's Spirit. The Holy Spirit. And everything changed.

They stood clinging to each other in the womb of the upper room because they were very, very afraid. The one they followed had upset the apple cart and overturned the spiritual, economic and religious system. And now He was nowhere to be found. Oh, they did experience His resurrection from the dead and were overjoyed to see that He had conquered death and would be going back to the Father from whence He came, but a lot of good that did them. They were left alone, orphans, and very, very afraid. With the authorities pounding at the door, threatening their lives, what did they do? What all fearful people do, they closed the doors, they locked them, they froze.

Oh, they did do one more thing. They prayed. They prayed the great prayer that comes automatically to the lips of those in peril: HELP! Help me, Jesus, help me! (This is one of my favorite prayers.) This may sound like a low level prayer but it's not. This is a prayer that comes out of desperation, anxiety and most of all vulnerability. And it seems like God cannot resist taking care of the vulnerable. Thank God because we are all vulnerable and very, very fragile.

In the Gospels Jesus gives an order to His disciples to ask and they will receive, seek and they will find, knock and the door will be opened to them. He is inviting, encouraging us to pray. For what? A new Mercedes? An American Girl doll? Two tickets to the Cubs World Series (okay, let's not push it)? No, God can give the only thing God has to give and that's... God. God can't or probably won't give us a new little red wagon but He can and always will send forth His Spirit for those who ask. So ask! What are you waiting for?

You may protest, "But I have asked and He hasn't answered." Fair enough. Keep asking. One of my favorite bits of spiritual wisdom comes from the black community that keeps on reminding us that, "God might not be there when you want Him but He's always on time." You see, the Divine presence of God's Spirit is all around us and even in us. This old world of ours is shot through and through with the Divine. It's a sacred universe. And that Spirit dwells within us as well. But it is often locked up. It is locked up by the very fear that grips us.

It is, indeed, kind of a spiritual catch 22 that we want to be released from fear by the power of the Spirit and it is our very fear that keeps us from allowing the Spirit to be unleashed. That's why praying is an act of faith. It is so much easier to do the woe-is-me thing than it is to say "Come, Holy Ghost. Come, Holy Spirit release me from my fear, set me free from my anxiety." This is a prayer that must be heard and will be answered in God's time and insofar as we are ready to receive it.

Sometimes it is hard to receive the Spirit of God because our container is so small or so filled. There is a wonderful Zen story of the man that sought enlightenment from the guru. The master said, "Of course I will give you enlightenment but first let's have a cup of tea." As he begins to pour the tea into his cup it came half way and then full, and then over full and was spilling over into the saucer and onto the man's lap. He shouted, "You can't put anymore in there. There is no more room." The master responded, "Exactly. You are so filled with yourself there is no room for enlightenment." We are so filled with our thoughts, anxieties, and fears. They constantly feed us and we feed on them so much that there simply is no room for the Spirit of God. Whenever I pray for healing the first thing I do is an exorcism. And you can do it yourself. Cast out the spirits of fear, anxiety, prejudice, hatred, resentment ... (fill in the blank). Send them off to Jesus to dispose of as He will and then ask for the Holy Ghost, pray for the Holy Spirit, seek God's perfect love which casts out all fear.

So, are you caught in the upper room? Are you gripped by your fears? It's time to get out. But I must warn you as the great theologian Karl Barth once warned, you don't dare say, "Come, Holy Ghost" unless

you mean it. God's Holy Spirit is neither a play thing nor a dumb waiter waiting to fulfill our every desire. God's Holy Spirit will burn off the chaf, cut out the sucker branches and prune the good ones so that you may be able to bear fruit. Receiving God's Holy Spirit is not about making you feel good but about the proclamation of the Kingdom. And as that begins to happen you will experience the fruits of the Holy Spirit: love, joy, peace, long-suffering, kindness, goodness, faithfulness, gentleness and self-control (Galatians 5:22). When you experience these things you will know that you have broken out of jail, the upper room has been unlocked, and you're free to go with utter confidence. At that point, say what you will, do what you do and it will have an effect. It is not you speaking, it is the Sprit speaking through you. At that point, we become a conduit for God's grace.

Today is Pentecost Sunday. It's your birthday. So? What do you really want for your birthday? Come, Holy Ghost.
