

Note from the Pastor



Pope Peter's Mother-in-Law

Last week when I wrote about the crisis in vocations and God's calling, I promised that I would address the

issue further. I've been a priest for over 42 years now and so I guess it's time to take one of the elephants out of the clerical closet and take a look at it. The elephant is mandatory celibacy for Roman Catholic priests.

There are a few issues in the Church we are not allowed to discuss but there are some that not only need to be brought out of the cobwebs of our mind but dusted off and looked at anew. One is the ordination of woman to the deaconate. Has it been done in the past? Could it be done? What are the advantages and liabilities of ordaining women to the deaconate? The head of the Church in France said last week that this needs to be discussed. The other issue, the one near and dear to my heart, is celibacy for diocesan priests. It is time, past time, to take a good, hard look at it.

In the early days of Vatican II when we were still in the seminary, we were told by certain professors that it was just a matter of time before celibacy became an option for diocesan priests. I thought to myself, "Don't hold your breath." And I was right. When I was ordained, I did not have my fingers crossed in hopes that the celibacy rule would change and, obviously, it didn't. Celibacy, like the call to priesthood is itself a charism and a gift of the Spirit. You can't mandate a gift. If you have the gift of being able to live a celibate, joyful life and also be called to the priesthood at the same time, well, oh, lucky you... oh, lucky me. Would that I could say the same thing for many of my classmates who were outstanding priests but as they psycho-sexually matured discovered they were not called to, or given the gift of being able to live a celibate life. Some of the best priests I know are now married with children and grandchildren. What a loss this has been for the people of God.

Once I began to mature I realized that living a celibate life was not only possible for me but something I was able to embrace. It did give me a freedom of availability for the people I served and while I could never quite grasp all the theological calisthenics that one had to go through to justify a celibate existence, I was still able to do it. But that is only half the story.

Marriage leads to children and while I was resigned that I would never be married, I had a terrible time accepting the fact that I would never have children.

I remember at the age of 27 being a newly minted priest looking out from my second story window onto the playground of St. Mary's Catholic grade school. There I watched the children play while I cried. I know first-hand the heart ache and the hole and the soul that results in being childless. But God was merciful to me and when I least expected it, my children (already toilet trained) showed up at my doorstep. The grandchildren followed. And, forgive me please, Lord, as much as I love being a priest I wouldn't trade my children and grandchildren for the world. As a matter of fact, I am guite convinced that my family has made me a much better priest. Many people have complained about many things I have done through the years but no one has ever berated me for being a parent or a grandparent. They know that I know what they know. It's made me a much more compassionate priest.

So why not married priests? It is just a law of the Church. Peter was married, the Apostles were married, the early Church fathers were married. It wasn't until the seventh century that they began to notice that priests were handing on their church's and their benefices to their children that they decided that, well, make them celibate and there will be no one to hand all this property on to. Doesn't sound too theological to me. It's always the economy, sweetheart. And it is the economy today. A single celibate priest comes a lot cheaper than a married one with kids. They are also a lot easier to move around. There are a lot of really good, practical arguments for a celibate clergy. Outside of Jesus', "some are made Theological? eunuchs for the Kingdom of God..." I am still trying to wrap my head around them.

This summer, our new Pope, Francis will be heading to Brazil for the world youth conference. I'm told it has the largest Catholic population in the world and that fully one-third of the churches have no regular Sunday Eucharist for lack of a priest. Our Holy Father seems to be open to the possibility that the celibate rule can change. Maybe it will, maybe it won't. But at least, at the very least we can talk about it.

Can we talk?

In Jesus, the Celibate (although Lazarus was his boy),
