## Note from the Pastor

## **Effective Altruism**

By now most of you are aware I am

becoming quite a fan of our new Pope He continues to surprise and delight with words and actions that get to the heart of the Gospel. A washing of feminine and non-Christian feet last Holy Thursday spoke volumes. Recently he said something that struck a chord in me and resonated with a truth that, once spoken, is self evident. Francis was praising atheists who do good. In essence, he said that if they are living a moral life and doing good for humanity that whether they are aware of it or not, what they are doing is a holy thing and God is in the midst of it. For the last thousand years the Church has been shouting amathama sit (let them go to hell) and now the Holy Father is praising them for participating in the work of God. There is a spiritual dictum that I truly take stock in: If you see peace, unity, love, forgiveness, mercy, no matter where it comes from, God is in it. Trust it. Where you see division, hatred, blame, anger, selfrighteousness... lay down your life. I write all of this because we are presently experiencing some of the most Christ-like actions being done by some rather secular (and very, very rich) people. While Jesus warns us that it is difficult for a rich person to enter into the Kingdom of God, obviously it is not impossible. We stand amazed when we watch Bill and Melinda Gates give away their entire fortune and Warren Buffet give away his not for specifically religious reasons, but simply because it is the right thing to do. There seems to be an inner morality that, if awakened, can lead us to changing the world for the better.

A few weeks ago in the Chicago Tribune there was a most interesting article entitled, "Working on Wall Street to Save the World" (Thursday, June 13, 2013). It was about a 25 year old technology wiz named Jason Trigg. He writes the software that turns a lot of money into even more money. And he makes a lot of money. And what does he do with it? He gives it away. According to the article his logic is simple: the more he makes the more he can do. He was inspired by the secular ethicist Peter Singer (Google: Peter Singer - Ted Talk) who argues from a secular point-ofview for literally saving the world. Traditionally if someone wanted to do good they went to the Peace Corps or various missions around the world. This new

breed feels they can do more by making a whole lot more and then giving it away. It's called Effective Altruism which is a mingling of both the mind and the heart. How do you do the most good with what you have? How do you leverage what you make to have the greatest effect? Singer tells the story of a little girl in China who was hit by a car caught on videotape. He then watched three people walk around her. By the time someone finds her it is too late. He then asked the audience how many of you would have stopped. And every hand went up. Then he asks, with 6.9 million children a year dying from preventable diseases which we can stop, how many of you are willing to do something about it?

But we protest we are not Bill Gates or managers of hedge funds. What can one person do? That was the question asked by two men who founded an organization called Give Well (givewell.org). This organization will show where you can get the best bang for your buck in saving children's lives. Matt Wage, a finance worker who gives half his income away put it this way, "You can pay to provide and train a guide dog for a blind American which costs about \$40,000. But with that money you could also cure between 400 and 2,000 people in developing countries of blindness from glaucoma, which costs about \$20 per person." Which is better? Give Well attempts to make that calculation.

Here's the point. We can change the world. Individually and collectively. And as members of the human community we have a moral obligation to do so. We do it for religious reasons but for whatever reason, at the core of our Effective Altruism there is a Divine impulse moving us to the good. And as our Holy Father has pointed out, it is not reserved to Catholics alone. But is from God.

Something to think about in the long days of summer.

#### PLASTIC WATER BOTTLES

Plastic water bottles are having a devastating effect on our ecosystems along our shores and beyond, and the worst part is, it could all be prevented. Did you know that more than 77% of plastic water bottles are not recycled, and that plastic makes up 80% of the trash that ends up in the ocean? Do your part to make sure your trip to the beach and the park this summer is green and plastic bottle-free. It's astounding that more than 9.5 million plastic bottles have been collected in coastal cleanups worldwide over the past 25 years. So pack a few reusable water bottles. Don't forget to fill them up first!

# CALL SENATORS DURBIN AND KIRK AT (202) 224-3121 TO OPPOSE THE FOLLOWING AMENDMENTS TO IMMIGRATION REFORM LEGISLATION:

CORNYN 1251: an amendment that would require virtually unachievable enforcement goals before undocumented persons can adjust to permanent resident status.

RUBIO 1225: an amendment that would require that undocumented persons learn English prior to adjustment to permanent resident status, not citizenship.

HATCH 1247-1249: amendments that would 1) require undocumented persons to pay back taxes before applying for registered provisional immigrant status; 2) eliminate Social Security credits earned while person was undocumented; and 3) require that persons earning legal permanent residence wait five years for tax credits under the Affordable Care Act (ACA).
