Note from the Pastor



The hardest, saddest and most painful day of my life was June 16, 1993. That was the day I was called to Riverside Hospital in Kankakee to inform my daughter, Tu Anh in Colorado that

her daughter Ange Michelle along with her paternal grandmother were killed in a head-on collision on Hwy. 17 west of the city. It was the day I also had to identify the bodies.

One of the sweetest days of my life was last Saturday. It was a day so full that I could not take it all in until it was over. Throughout the day I got to celebrate the fullness of my priesthood, fatherhood and being a brand new grandpa. The day began with the joyful funeral of Pauline Kerpen who had lived a long and full life. We ended the service at the funeral home playing and humming along to the Beer-Barrel Polka at the request of the deceased. What a good woman; what a good life. In the afternoon there was great joy in the church as Joseph Byelick and Theresa Kowalski became one in Nuptial bliss. It was a glorious wedding of heaven and earth, man and woman all coming together. At 3:30 I did not feel like the Maytag repair man (the loneliest man in town) because the line for confessions was long and steady. At the 4:30 Mass, of course, Sister Bridget told us of the marvelous missions of Mother Cabrini's sisters. In between all of this activity I celebrated the Sacrament of the Sick with four different parishioners who were preparing for surgery. (You do know that it is the Sacrament of the Sick not Extreme Unction).

The piece de resistance, however, was the Mass and Baptism of my brand new eight year old granddaughter Huei-Min. Only when the day was done did I fully realized that I, as a priest, not only got to be at three of the biggest moments in our lives (hatched, matched, and dispatched) but was also able to be a catalyst for forgiveness and healing. Not a bad day to be a priest. Not a bad day to be a father having his family around him for the weekend and a wonderful day to be a grand-father.

Talking on the telephone is not my strong suit. My daddy taught us to get on, get the message and hang up. So I don't chit-chat too well except for with my daughter Tu Anh. Religiously, every Saturday morning we are on the phone with each other for a good half hour (my telephone conversations with my son Luis lasts all of 32 seconds.) We talk about everything but mostly how the kids are doing. And the kids are growing up fast and maturing quite nicely. Mу grandson L.A. who lived with us a couple of years ago has a new girlfriend and is studying I.T. His older sister Rafie and brother Immanuel are both living on their own. And the baby of the family, Ange Gabrielle is going to be a senior in high school (my how quickly they grow). Now, the dream of Tu Anh and her husband Lewis has always been go to the missions once the children were grown. And then, surprise of surprises, "Father, you are going to be a grandpa one more time." "Ah, beloved daughter, you've past the half-century mark. If you're going to be a mother again, you must be drinking some of that Sarah and Elizabeth juice." "No, no, Father, I'm going to adopt."

Tu Anh is our resident mystic. She sees deep and profound connections where the rest of us are oblivious. Both Tu Anh and Lewis, an acupuncturist and chiropractor, are in the healing professions. They work mainly with poor immigrants from Russia and Somalia. One day, Tu Anh performed a small miracle on Somalian woman, dressed in full burga, who could hardly stand up. Not only did she allow Tu Anh to touch her ailing body, but received a wonderful healing from her touch. She was so overwhelmed that she blessed Tu Anh with these words, "May you have many, many more children." Tu Anh smiled at her dearly and explained to her while she may look like she is 30 years old, she is not. The woman assured her there were more children to come into her life. And there were. Shortly after that Tu Anh heard of a young Taiwanese girl who had a most difficult infancy and childhood and was now in need of adoption. Having discussed it with Lewis and her children, who would all have to be part of the family raising process, they all agreed to adopt. Except for me. "I love you dearly, girl but are you crazy?" "No, no, Father, I know what I am doing." And she usually does.


Last Saturday at the Baptism, Tu Anh did something I have not seen her do in 20 years. While she was sharing with the extended family (Lewis has seven brothers and most were there with their children and grandchildren), she began to cry. The full realization and connection of what was happening came down upon her. Never giving it a second thought, she told



the adoption agency that she would take the new child on the 17th of June. The prophecy of the Somalian Muslim woman came true. But even more. It is only after Huei-Min came into her life that she realized that it was exactly that day 20 years earlier that she embraced the body of her eight year old daughter Ange Michelle. It was Ange who sent this little one to them. And the emotions were overwhelming.

There is nothing more difficult than life. There is nothing more beautiful than life. And the only thing that Jesus promised us is life and life abundant. The cross? Of course. The resurrection? Without doubt. And life goes on... forever.


MARY QUEEN OF HEAVEN PRESCHOOL AND KINDERGARTEN ENRICHMENT
