Note from the Pastor



An Open Letter to my Granddaughter, Azucena Gonzalez on Her 15th Birthday

My dear beloved granddaughter,

In a few days you turn 15 and, as you know, in the Mexican tradition it's a really big deal. *Feliz Quince Años!* Your grandpa's really proud of you (not to mention your mom and dad).

For over a year now I have been asking you if you wanted to have a *Quinceañera* celebration. You always demurred (go ahead, look it up) and said in your best adolescence patois (I'm on a roll here), "I dunno." Now for those reading this who don't know, a *Quince Años* celebration in the Mexican culture is a huge coming out party or cotillion. It is when a young girl is said to become a woman. Back in the old country, it's not a big deal. Here, with the advent of MTV's sickening "My Sweet 16 Party," it has escalated into something that would cause a father to remortgage the house to pay for the pachanga, the party afterwards. You and I both know that's really silly. And so you demurred.

"Azucena!" (ah soo sā nah) I love your name. I love the sound of it. I love the way it rolls off the tongue, all four syllables of it. Your friends call you "Ozzie" (The only Ozzie I know was married to a woman named Harriet... and then there is Osborne but... I will never call you Ozzie.) Most of all I love the meaning of your name, Tiger Lily. It names you well. Delicate as a flowering lily and tough as a tiger. Of all the lilies, the daylily, the tiger lily is the heartiest and the most colorful. Your parents named you well.

You are the first born of the second set of my grandchildren. Right after you were born I flew to Denver to hold you in my arms and show you off to anyone who might pass by. As a toddler going to morning Mass with your mother, you were the center of attention for all the old grandmas who daily attended. At 31/2 you got your first two-wheeler with those training wheels that were soon to come off. By now you were the big sister to a baby brother (oh joy, oh

joy). By five you were ready to enter kindergarten and you moved with mommy and daddy into Grandpa's house in Wheaton. You insisted that I paint your new room pink and put glow in the dark stars all over the ceiling (a greater love no grandpa has). By first grade you were in your new house in Carol Stream just in time for the birth of your baby sister. How proud you were as you held her in your arms in the hospital room. By second grade you were ready for piano lessons and you haven't stopped since then, adding flute and guitar (and you even play the radio pretty well). Watching you grow up has been one of the great joys of my life and now you are about to enter into a whole new phase. Now you are about to turn 15 and all that it means for an older girl and a young woman... and it means a lot.
