Note from the Pastor



On the Stigma of Mental Illness

I recently received an email from a student at Elmhurst College named Sara Hynes. In it she writes that she has recently formed an "Active Minds Chapter" at Elmhurst College. She goes on to write, "Our chapter's mission is to increase the awareness of the students, faculty and staff at Elmhurst College on issues surrounding mental health, removing stigma surrounding mental illness, promoting a general awareness of holistic health and providing a forum with which people are comfortable for students to speak up about mental health.

"This Fall our Active Minds Chapter will be participating in a walk hosted by NAMI (National Alliance on Mental Illness) of Greater Chicago. It will take place September 21 at 3:00 p.m. in the city. I am hoping to receive your support in this event whether it be through your donations or participation in the walk, or the act of spreading the word on this event. If you have any questions, do not hesitate to send me an email (hyness@net.elmhurst.edu). Thank you for your support."

This is a most timely message and I am happy to support her in her efforts. For many years now I have been associated with a twelve-step mental health group in Kankakee called GROW. Based on the twelve steps of AA they firmly believe that friendship, honest and open communication and most of all, nonjudgmental love heals. They had a residential house in the city and were very active members of our little parish, St. Teresa. The most wonderful part of it all was that their mental illness was out of the closet, not hidden and most definitely nothing to be ashamed of. As they interacted with our little faith community we came to realize that we needed them as much as they needed us. Probably even more.

The Body of Christ is wounded. The first thing Jesus showed His Disciples after the Resurrection were His wounds. "Go ahead, touch them" and, paradoxically He healed. By His wounds we are healed of our own wounds and thus we become wounded healers.

But you can't heal a wound that is hidden. Wounds only become healed when they are exposed to the light. If we are made to be ashamed of our wound we will only hide it all the more where it will fester and make us even sicker. We used to hide the wound of cancer and wouldn't even talk about it thinking it would go away. It didn't. Today, with the stigma removed, our cure rate is so much better. Today, however, we are still sadly hiding the wounds of mental illness. And in our burying this reality we are allowing it to become an epidemic in our society. It is time to bring it out of the closet.

This was the message of the Rev. Rick Warren, pastor of the mega-church in Arizona whose son had recently taken his life after a 27 year life-long struggle with mental illness. In his first sermon after his son's Matthew's death he confided to his people that his number one prayer to God was to heal the mental health of his child. And in the shock of his son's death he had to ask himself why did God not answer his prayer? He used every resource available to him, the best of everything, and to no avail. Now what? He admitted that he was still in a state of shock one month after losing his child and that a lot of his questions are still unanswered and most likely never will be. In the midst of his pain, however, he began to glimpse something more.

He took consolation in the Scriptures that told him that God will wipe away every tear from our eyes and turn our mourning into joy. He then said something striking, "Your illness is not your identity. chemistry is not your character." Six years ago I was seriously sick with endocarditis and while I had the disease, I was not the disease. There's no stigma to having a physical ailment. Then why the shame and stigma of mental illness? Why do we feel that somehow it is our fault and that we are less than good when it strikes us? There is something that has to change here. And he is dedicating himself to helping us all to become aware of the change that needs to be. He is convinced that, "God wants us to take our greatest loss and turn it into our greatest life message." And in our woundedness we become healers.

The Body of Christ is wounded and we at Mary Queen are members of that Sacred Body. All of us in some way or another have been touched by this dread disease. All are in need of healing and all are called to be healers.
