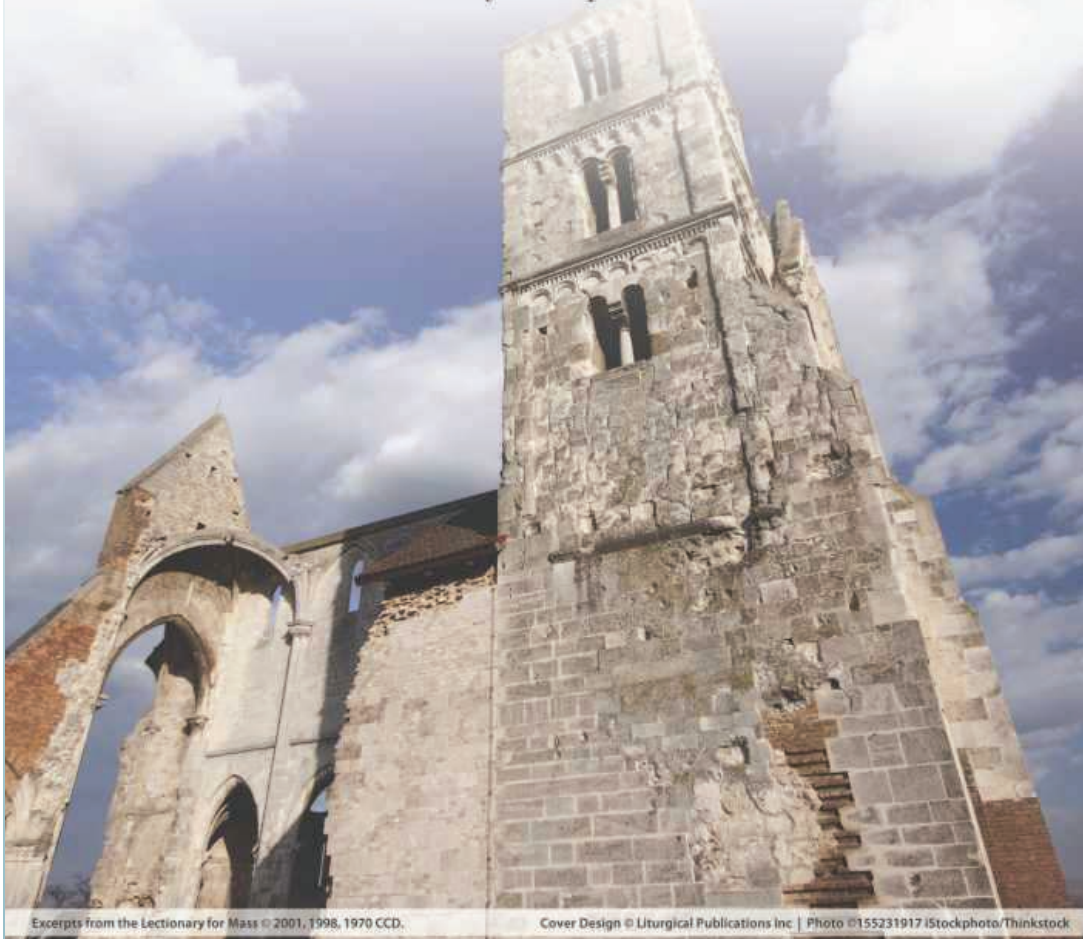

Note from the Pastor



The Making of a Pope (Part I)

To me, the true proof of the power and the presence of the Holy Spirit in the Roman Catholic Church is that after 2,000 years of some pretty shabby management and even incredible corruption, we're still here. If, indeed, power corrupts and absolute power corrupts absolutely we never cease to be in a caldron of chaos. From power and land grabbing popes, to bishops who were Lords of the Manor, to the Inquisition and the Crusades, to the children of popes becoming popes and most recently the sex abuse and banking scandals, it seems the Church survives in spite of its sinfulness because there is something even greater than corrupt leadership and sin. It is the presence of the Divine. The promise of the Christ holds true, "I will be with you until the end of time." And this Spirit continually calls us to the fullness of Christ's consciousness. No matter how deeply we get caught in the systems of the world (and by no means is the Church immune) at the moment when all seems lost and we are drowning, something happens. A Saint shows up. And the transformation into Christ's consciousness continues. Oh, it does, it does.

The last 30 or so years have not been easy ones for the Church. After a flurry of new life and activity ushered in by the Second Vatican Council, things had begun to change. Good Pope John XXIII opened the windows of a once-confined Church and the Spirit blew out. The problem with this Spirit, however, is that it blows where it will. And it seemed to blow especially over the laity giving them a sense that, maybe for the first time in their lives, *they* were the Church. This was easy to believe because the Council documents confirmed it. And soon they found themselves acting upon it. Prior to the Council, if you wanted to be holy, if you wanted to be a missionary, even if you wanted to teach in the Catholic schools you became a religious sister, brother or a priest. With the Council's universal call to holiness that door was now open to all. The consequences of this were wonderful and not so wonderful. There was a new freedom in the Church but often a line was crossed that took us into a sense of license where anything goes. Theology was sometimes reduced to blowing up balloons, saying "have a nice day" and smiley face buttons. I remember telling my

seminary students in the mid-70's that I was going to teach them a class called, "Beyond Balloons."

Now we know for every action there is a reaction and because we were becoming ecumenical and open to all, many in the Church began to believe that we were losing our identity. In the old Church if there was anything we had as Catholics it was a strong identity. We didn't eat meat on Friday, we never missed Church on Sunday and if you were not Catholic, you were then a "public," and that was to the peril of your immortal soul. When the doors opened and the wind blew in so much changed that it got scary. Many in the Church began to circle the wagons.

I've lived long enough to know it is true that the pendulum, indeed, does swing. The reaction to what was perceived as a loosey - goosey church with seminaries and convents emptying and an anything-goes mentality was a pulling in of the reins and the re-introduction of a neo-orthodoxy. The individual interpretation of the scriptures gave way to the Catechism of the Catholic Church and the age of questioning was being countered by "Catholic answers." And through all of this confusion the Church began to lose its members on both the left and the right.

Now, if the dam breaks or the levee leaks what are you to do? You seal up the borders. You patch up the cracks and you cover the leaks. I dare say the greatest crisis in my lifetime for the Catholic Church has been the institutional sin of covering up the cultural and individual sin of Catholic clergy sex abuse. The major purpose of any human institution is to keep the institution going... at all costs. Government, educational, mercantile, military and even ecclesial institutions will do whatever is necessary to cover up the leaks and the holes, the corporate sins, if you will, that are inherent in any institution. What's the military brass trying to do in the face of their sexual assault crisis? The same thing the Church did. Cover it up! And as we have learned so very many, many times, it's never the sin, it's always the cover up. That's exactly what's going on with the crisis of the Vatican bank right now. So what is one to do? From a purely human institutional point of view, you cover it up some more. Praise God, the Church isn't merely human. Nothing is



merely human. The spark of the Divine dwells in all of creation and the Church, the carrier of the Divine, praise God, is no exception. Somehow, in the midst of the darkness, a light begins to shine.
