

### Note from the Pastor



I love one-liners. They say so much in so little time and space. Jesus must have loved them too because he used so many, "If you want to find your life, lose your life." "The first shall be last and

the last shall be first." Our new Holy Father Francis along with Henny Youngman (take my wife... please) uses them quite effectively. He recently said, "Right now, we don't have a very good relation with creation." One of my personal favorites is, "The hardest thing for an American to say in 25 words or less is 'good-bye'."

Another one of my favorite one-liners comes from an old Holiday Inn commercial when they advertised, "The best surprise is no surprise." No one is going to throw you a curve ball at the last minute. You know exactly what to expect.

So in the interest of "letting the cat out of the bag" (which is a whole lot easier than putting it back in), I wish to announce in only one line that, "Come June I will be retiring." There. I wrote it. And talk about your mixed emotions. I love being a priest. And I love pastoring Mary Queen of Heaven in Elmhurst. This is one sweet parish with really sweet people. To say I will miss you all is the understatement of the year. But it's time. It really is. In early March I will be turning 70 years old and Bishop Conlon has given me permission to retire in June.

Tennis players hit their prime in their early 20's, women in their mid-30's and priests don't hit their prime until they are in their early 50's. By the time I was 50 years old I realized that I finally had some idea of what I was doing and still had the energy to do it. Now that I am approaching 70 I am not quite sure what I am doing and while I can still do what I did then, it takes me forever to recover from doing it. It is amazing how Sundays bump into Mondays and Mondays ain't easy. I must confess that I tire easily. And, truth be told, I'm really tired of running things, of being in charge. No one told us in the seminary how much administration would be involved in being a priest. And while I love being a priest, I am not such a hot administrator. I marvel at those who do it well and have a natural talent for it. I don't.

There is an old saying, "Shoemaker, stick to your last." It means, do what you do well. Well, my last (and my first for that matter) is the proclamation of the Kingdom and the preaching of Good News. From that, one never retires.

In the Hindu tradition there are four stages of life. The first is that of the celibate student. Learn all you can for what you are going to do. That I have done.

The second is that of the householder. The work of the householder is to make sure that the household doesn't fall apart, make sure the bills are paid, the kids are fed, your wife is loved and there is peaceful order in your household. I have been a householder for 42 years now. And if I don't take the next step I will simply continue repeating what I have done all these years. And there is something more.

The third stage in life is that of the forest dweller or hermit. Once your family is raised, once you've taken care of the responsibilities as the head of the household, you may now leave to take the time to go deeper into your soul, deeper into your life. But you cannot go to the third stage until you leave the second. And so, leave I must.

Immediately after retirement in June I will spend several months readjusting to my new life and grieving the loss of the old. It will be a sabbatical time where I hope to give the Lord permission to prepare me for the next step. What that will be, what that will look like concretely, I don't know but I am certainly open to all the possibilities.

The fourth stage in life is the wandering sannyasa or ascetic. I'm not even thinking about that yet. One step at a time.

And so I tell you long before I leave that I am leaving. It's much better that way. We as a parish can now begin to say our "good-byes" and even begin the grieving process. If we are going to receive a new shepherd and receive him well, we first have to let go of that which we already have. And it isn't easy. But it is good. When you know you're going to leave, every moment becomes much more holy, much more sacred.



The spiritual masters tell us that we should always keep our leaving (our death) before our eyes. It focuses the soul to the moment that we have and that moment becomes precious. I pray that all the time we have together between now and June be as holy and as sacred a time as it can be. I pray that during this time of transition we can all learn to let go gracefully.

If we do that well, we will be able to say the ultimate one-liner if you see me the day after I was supposed to leave and am still here, "Oh, forgotten but not gone." While we must separate, we will never forget each other. We've had some pretty wonderful years.
