

Note from the Pastor



Transition Lenses

Bright light bothers my eyes so I have always had a pair of very dark

prescription sunglasses. I never bought a pair of the early version of 'transition' lenses because no matter how indoors you were they retained that rose colored tint that made you look perpetually stoned. I never wanted to be confused with Father Guido Sarducci so I always kept two pairs of glasses at the ready. But there is a little of Father Guido in all of us so I finally gave in and recently bought a pair of glasses that go from completely clear to very dark and then clear again according to the environment. And I love them.

Transitions. The ancient philosopher Heraclitus told us that you can never step into the same river twice. Life is constantly changing, in flux, in transition. Transitions always keep us just a little off balance. And being off balance can cause anxiety. There is something in us that longs for surety and security. Something solid. Something that lasts forever. Most of our fairytales end, after overcoming some trial or difficulty, "and they lived happily ever after." That belief from our early childhood has locked in our psyche. The problem is these are fairytales. On this earth nothing is permanent. Everything changes. We are in continual transition. We never "arrive."

So, here we have two seemingly contradictory things operating at the same time: 1) We long for surety, security and that still point that keeps us anchored. 2) We are perpetual motion machines. We are always a little off balance. We need them both. Once you learn to walk you cannot make progress unless you get a little off balance. But at the same time if you fall, who is there to pick you up, to give you security? That's the glory of our faith. There is something that never changes and is rock solid secure. It is our relationship with the Divine, with our God. God never changes but we do.

Once we know in our soul that nothing can take that love and security away, we can dance our dance, be a little off balance and even eccentric. It is how the world moves along. This moment in which we find ourselves right now, will never come again. It is unique, scared, and passing away. But we could never have this moment without that which has gone before us. There is a wonderful saying that goes, "For what has been, 'thank you.' For what will be, 'yes.' " I love being a traditional Catholic. The word tradition means "handing over" or handing on. Everything I have and everything I am has been handed on to me from generations past. How liberating not to have to invent the wheel or discover fire all by myself. It has been done for me. And every generation and every individual added to the spiritual development of who we are today. We dare not throw it away. It is too sacred. And so for what has been we say, 'thank you.'

And because we stand on the shoulders of the holy people who have gone before us, we can now be free to add our own two cents, our own talents and gifts. As we receive all that has been, we are now free to continue the journey with our own experiences and insights for the next generation. And what is so wonderful is that we don't have to do it once and for all, we are a work in progress. We are in, transition. I used to have a sign on my door that read, PBPGIFWMY. It stood for, "Please be patient, God isn't finished with me yet." I am a work in progress. There is something even more.

By nature, I'm an optimist. I continue to choose to believe that all the pains and struggles we are going through right now, the pains and struggles that our ancestors went through as well are not death thros but birth pangs. When it is happening, it is hard to tell whether it is death or birth. In a way it is both. Insofar as I choose to be part of the process, I carry humanity along with me to the next step. I will never see the end product because it is a work in progress. My moment, however, is sacred. And so I shall dance the dance in knowing that I am on the solid ground of God's love, I shall lose balance, fall once in a while, get picked up and move on. And it is time to move on.

One of my heroes, Bishop Oscar Romero saw this most clearly shortly before his martyrdom. Great changes were coming to his little church in San Salvador and he was part of them. He wrote a little meditation on creating the Church of the 21st Century. It bears reprinting.

Creating the Church of the 21st Century

It helps now and then to step back and take the long view. The Kingdom is not only beyond our efforts, it is even beyond our vision.

We accomplish in our lifetime only a tiny fraction of the magnificent enterprise that is God's work. Nothing we do is complete, which is another way of saying that the Kingdom always lies beyond us. No statement says all that could be said. Nor prayer fully expresses our faith. No confession brings perfection, no pastoral visit brings wholeness. No program accomplishes the Church's mission. No set of goals and objectives includes everything.

This is what we are about: We plant seeds that one day will grow. We water seeds already planted, knowing that they hold future promise. We lay foundations that will need further development. We provide yeast that produces effects far beyond our capability.

We cannot do everything, and there is a sense of liberation in realizing that. This enables us to do something, and to do it very well. It may be incomplete, but it is a beginning, a step along the way, an opportunity for the Lord's grace to enter and do the rest.

We may never see the end results, but that is the difference between the master builder and the worker. We are workers, not master builders; ministers, not messiahs. We are prophets of a future not our own. Amen.

Christ is our still point. He gives us the security to be insecure, to move on. Move it.
