

Note from the Pastor



Nothing goes down sweeter or is more titillating to the imagination than rich, juicy gossip. Most fun is the gossip that has no basis in reality, rumor gossip.

The problem is, however, that while it is sweet going down, it turns sour in the stomach and will eventually poison the entire system. It is not only unhealthy for the target of the rumored gossip but for the entire community, not to mention the gossiper. So while it may be initially fun, it's very dangerous stuff.

I write this because as a public person I get rumored about and gossiped about constantly. Most of it never gets to my ears which is fine by me but at least once a year I hear someone tell me that the word on the street is that I just fathered a child and any day now will be leaving the priesthood. As Mark Twain famously said, "The rumors of my demise are greatly exaggerated." And as for me, I have enough trouble getting out of bed in the morning let alone hopping into bed. NONE OF IT IS TRUE.

The most recent rumor is that after I retire Mary Queen will be swallowed up by I.C. and the preschool will be closed. Ain't true! And the one making the circuit right now is, "Have you noticed that Father Tony is beginning to forget a lot of people's names? Some people are saying they think he has early dementia." Makes one wonder who the "some people" are.

Now it is true, as I have publicly stated a number of times, that learning and retaining names and faces are not my strong suit. It was only a couple of years ago after having watched an episode of 60 Minutes on "face blindness" that I thought that maybe that's what I had. So I went to the 60 Minutes Overtime site and took a test they had for face blindness. Sure enough, I flunked cold. (And I just thought that all white people looked alike.) I was happy to know that face blindness had nothing to do with one's cognitive abilities. Obviously, our mental state and our mental health is very important to all of us. I have written on a number of occasions about taking mental issues out of the closet and dementia is one of them.

The first time it hit home with me personally was when I was a very young man and my father was coming out of surgery and the drugs were just

beginning to wear off. He began speaking utter nonsense which literally scared the begeezes out of me. "That's not my father," I thought. "This can't be happening to me." I know, that's a pretty immature response but at that time I was pretty immature. I couldn't imagine my father not having it all together; after all he was my rock, my hero. Finally the drugs completely wore off and he was fine until the day he died. My mother, on the other hand, stayed mentally alert until she was about 85. At 83 she was still working in my brother's store, kibitzing with the customers. By 86 she began to forget, to talk in non sequiturs, and became quite confused. By this time I was a lot more mature. I was in my late 50's and she was able to live in my rectory and, thank God, I was able to take care of her and love her for who she was until the Lord took her home.

Since dementia really is no laughing matter, I googled the signs of it to find out if the rumors about me were true. There are a whole bunch of sites listing a whole bunch of symptoms but most of them boiled down to these ten.

- 1. Memory loss. It's called MCI or mild cognitive impairment. It is the inability to recall short-term or recent events. Short term is not a problem for me. I can remember almost all of the points of a Homily that I preach and if I have a wedding, the names of all the people in a wedding party. But once a Homily is preached and the wedding is over, I hit delete.
- 2. Decline in motor functions. This is an inability to perform routine tasks. I still exercise 4-6 days a week and while the osteoarthritis makes it difficult to roll out of bed, I can still touch my toes, drive a stick shift and pour wine into a Chalice (not to mention brandy into a snifter).
- 3. Disorientation. Getting lost on a routine trip. Driving north on 1-294 and exiting at 1-290 west is still, and always will be a pain in the neck. But I remember how to do it.
- 4. Behavioral changes. Personality changes. This includes radically changing your personality and making inappropriate pronouncements. You all will have to tell me how I'm doing on this.
- 5. Paranoia. Someone once told me if you weren't a little paranoid, you were crazy. But honestly, I do not think you are out to get me.



- 6. Disorganization. I have been running a household for 42 years now and my basic principle of organization is to surround myself with the very best and then get out of their way. I'm an organizational genius.
- 7. Agitation. This is frustration over an inability to perform simple tasks, or an inability to communicate clearly. (I hope this is all making sense to you.)
- 8. Hallucinations. Seeing things that aren't there. Not on my list.
- 9. Sexual acting out. Removing clothing in public and saying inappropriate sexual things. Doubly not on my list.
- 10. Cognitive decline. An inability to retain language and speech. Not yet (at least not in English).

When I was a little boy, my second grade CCD teacher, Sister Malochay (we called her Sister Malarchy) told us the story of a woman who went to confession and confessed gossiping. For Penance the priest told her to "take a feather pillow and empty it out on a top of a hill and let the wind blow it away." She came back the next week and reported that she had done her penance. The priest told her, "Now, go. Pick up all those feathers and put them back in the pillowcase." "But Father, that's impossible, they're spread all over the place." "So is your gossip." She never gossiped again.

Let's face it. It's fun to dish the dirt. But be careful, because if you dish it out enough, sooner or later you're going to have to eat it.


