## Note from the Pastor



### I Hate to Go To Confession

I hate to go to confession. But I do. At least once a month whether I need to or not (okay, okay, I need to). So, why do I hate it and why do I go?

I hate it because it involves saying out loud that which I would rather keep hidden... my sins. As any of our second graders who have just made their First Reconciliation can tell you, it is the nature of sin to hide itself. They won't use those words, they'll use the words, "not me." "Did you eat the cookies I just baked, did you fight with your brothers, who left the light on, who forgot to put down the toilet seat???" "Not me!" In the short term, denial is a wonderful thing and our politicians have raised it to an art form called deniability. But as the Scriptures make clear, that which is put down and hidden is going to be shouted from the rooftops. While it may be the nature of the sin to try to hide itself, sooner or later, the truth will come out. And the truth will set you free. But, of course, first it will make you miserable.

We don't like the truth and as Jack Nicholson reminds us, "You can't handle the truth." Why? Because the truth is, we are all a whole lot less than perfect. We have all sinned, we have all screwed up. And in a general sense we will admit that. Our politicians again, "Well, nobody's perfect. Mistakes were made." (Don't you just love the passive voice?) But as to specifics? Forgedaboutit. Maybe if I don't talk about it or if I bury it, it will go away. No, it won't.

Sin operates not on the physical but in the spiritual realm. Things physical tend to heal themselves. Our wonderful physical body is self-healing. I always tell our young mothers that they have the power to heal by simply kissing the bumps and bruises of their little ones. Spread a little bacteria over them and watch them get better. Not so with the spiritual. And sin is spiritual. One never buries hurt, anger, deceit, resentment, fear, bitterness, judgments and character assassination dead. You bury it alive. And it never goes away. And it begins to poison the system. And no matter how much you cover it up with the makeup of propriety there is still something rotten in Denmark. And it's your soul.

No matter how hard you try to put on a happy face on the outside, it is literally killing you on the inside. It is spiritual garbage. When I teach the children about Reconciliation, I ask them if good people get garbage in their house. After some hemming and hawing the answer is always, "Well, I guess so, yes." But do good people keep garbage in their house? And the answer is a straightforward "no". And why not? Because if you don't dump the garbage it begins to stink to high heaven. I rest my case.

Why do I go to confession even if I don't like it? I get tired of stinking and being weighed down by my sin. The only way to get rid of a negative spirit is to name it, claim it and then bring it to the surface. Naming it is critical. Saying it out loud is imperative. I hate saying it out loud. But I have to. If I don't, I begin to delude myself. One of my favorite stories about why it is necessary to confess out loud comes from my mother. When I was in second grade about to make my First Confession I whined to her that I didn't want to go because my Protestant friends didn't have to go. They just confessed to God. "Doesn't God hear me," I asked? Then she told me the story. Once there were two businessmen. One Catholic and the other Protestant (this was the early 50's). They were about to embark on a business deal. The Catholic wasn't sure if it was just right so he went to confession and talked about it with the priest. The priest explained to him that no, he couldn't go through with it because it was immoral and showed him why. He went back to his partner and said, "We can't do it." "Why," his partner replied. "Because I went to the priest..." "You went to the priest! You went to a man and told him what you were going to do? And he told you it was immoral? That's insane! I went straight to God and He didn't say a word." Wise mother.

And so, I go to confession. I hate it. But I do it. Why? I want to be free. I don't want to carry this garbage around all the days of my life. And I want you to be free too. That's the reason we have special Penance services two times a year. We have one coming up this Tuesday. I'm always amazed, for easy as we make it, how few people show up. Do you get it? Do you understand how powerful it is? How necessary it is?

## Note from the Pastor (cont.)

Some of you don't come because you really do need to sit down and talk. Some have things that go back many, many years and are very deep, profound and destroying. Some of you need to come on a Saturday afternoon at 3:30 to get it out. Well, I'm there. And I must confess, as much as I hate to go to confession, I don't like hearing confessions. But I am a really good confessor. Why? Because I am a pretty good sinner. I will listen with compassion and do all I can to point you in the right direction. And I will because it really isn't me talking to you, it's God's Holy Spirit. It constantly boggles my mind what comes out of my mouth on your behalf. One thing I know is that it is not me. It is humbling and powerful at exactly the same time. The most wonderful thing, however, is that when you walk out of that confessional, you're free. You've dumped the garbage. So, what the hell are you waiting for? We will be here Tuesday (four priests, no waiting), and I'm here on Saturdays. Confess and be free.
