

Note from the Pastor



"So," I say to the little kids after almost every Mass during Advent, "What did the cat have after he crossed the desert?" By now, they know the answer (I've been using the same

silly joke since 1973). They smile at me and say, "Sandy Claws." (I know, I know, but at least it's better than the horse that walks into the bar and the bartender says, "Why the long face?") For the kids and me, this has become an Advent ritual. And I love rituals.

A ritual is something you do over and over again in pretty much the same manner and the same order. They are very important because they give, well, order to one's life. I, personally, am a fan of the dictum, "early to bed, early to rise..." and I ritually tuck myself into bed at 9:00 p.m. every night and ritually pop out of bed after the 4:00 a.m. CBS morning news, weigh myself on the scale, groan, turn up the heat (I ritually lowered it the night before), make my way downstairs, grind the coffee beans, make the coffee, go upstairs, make my bed, check the weather, go downstairs, pour the coffee, come upstairs, say my morning prayers. And then it's off to the Courts for morning exercise (which has its own rituals). We are creatures of habit and our habits give us a sense of order. (So, which sock do you put on first?)

In addition to our individual daily rituals, we have, obviously, religious rituals. I am forever harping on parents to make sure that Sunday after Sunday after Sunday they "religiously" take their kids to Church and worship as a family. Religious worship orders our life and right worship puts our life in order. We are forever hearing that we need to get our priorities straight. If the Divine and the Divine order is, indeed, the pinnacle of our life, then everything else falls into place. Talk about the power of ritual.


And then there are the family rituals. Sunday afternoon dinner in my mother's house was sacred. The only thing that varied week after week was the type of pasta she would cook but everything else remained the same. When my grandson Abraham was three, he burst into tears because one Saturday night after the Spanish Mass we dared to try to go out to a restaurant for dinner instead of staying at home to eat pizza.

We were breaking the ritual. We stayed at home and ate pizza.

In a few days, we will all be celebrating our most sacred family and religious rituals. For some of you, the 4:00 p.m. children's Mass is sacred. For others, it will be the midnight Mass (which here begins at 10:30 p.m. with Christmas caroling). And when you get home you will be opening your presents at different times and in different ways. But it will all have a very ritualistic character about it. It needs to be done just so. And you will. It's that important. As the years go by, some rituals will begin to fade (I can't wait for Black Friday, let alone Gray Thursday to collapse and disappear) and some you will create anew. What are some of the things for you and your family to do not only at Christmastime but also throughout the year?

Two-thousand years ago, something new was created. The almighty and all-powerful Divine took on the flesh of weak and mortal humanity. And everything changed forever. To help us remember and celebrate this greatest of all events, St. Francis made the very first nativity scene and ritualistically we have recreated it ever since. We will bring our children again this year before that scene so they can kneel down and wonder at the fact that this little baby, a child just like them, is God in the flesh. At when they grow up, they will do the same with their children. My, what a wonderful ritual.




